From Father King +++ Glory to Jesus Christ!

Last week I talked about the importance of the Sacrament

of Reconciliation. This week I'd like to talk about some "changes" to confession. Every few years since 2011, there has been a newly published updated translation of one of the ritual books of the Church. After the new translation of the Mass we now have updated Baptism, Weddings, and Christian Initiation. Just last week the new translation of the Order of Penance went into effect. The changes are not dramatic. The new words are in **bold**.

God the Father of Mercies through the death and resurrection of His Son has reconciled the world to Himself and **poured out** the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church, may God **grant** you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

It is only a few words but it is a good time for us to meditate on them. How has God given you pardon and peace when you have been reconciled in the past? When have you experienced an outpouring of the Holy Spirit that has lead to conversion?

Along with the new translation of the prayer of absolution is a new formula for the Act of Contrition. Nota Bene! You don't need to update your act of contrition! As long as you say you are sorry and want to change (and will do the penance the priest assigns you) any words are fine. Stick with the ones you know! With that said, I do like the new one offered:

CONTINUED....

continued...O my God, I am sorry and repent with all my heart for all the wrong I have done and for the good I have failed to do, because by sinning I have offended you, who are all good and worthy to be loved above all things. I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid the occasions of sin. Through the merits of the Passion of our Savior Jesus Christ, Lord, have mercy.

In the next few bulletins we will be publishing a different act of contrition each week. May they be beneficial to your prayer!

You may have noticed that our "Budgeted Income Needed" jumped from \$12,942.00 up to \$15,315.00. How did our expenses increase \$2,300 a week??? Well, the weekly "Budgeted Income Needed" is based on our annual budget divided by the 52 weeks of the year. I recently discovered that we had not changed the number in the bulletin since APRIL 30, 2017!!! As you can imagine, costs have increased dramatically in the past 6 years. Just think how expensive fuel costs have become in the past year! The new figure of \$15k+ is based on our budgeted needs July 2022 thru January 2023 divided by the proper number of weeks. I also asked that the bingo expenses be placed on a separate line. I will do my best to keep our financial reports current and transparent. I thank everyone for their past and continued support and generosity toward our Parish of St. John Neumann.

PARISH "LENTEN SACRIFICES" FOOD DRIVE Since 2011


