

Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST

AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

Glory to Jesus Christ!

Today, September 8, the USA celebrates Grandparents Day. In the Church, this is usually celebrated on the Sunday closest to the Feast of St. Joachim and Anne, Jesus' grandparents (July 26). The bishops in the US have received permission to celebrate it with the rest of our country. Pope Francis' theme for Grandparents Day this year is "Do not cast me off in my old age" (cf. Ps 71:9). In his message (can be found on the Vatican website) the Holy Father reflects that in our contemporary culture many older people feel that they no longer have a place in society. They feel abandoned or isolated. The Pope looks to the root of this and blames several false beliefs. One he mentions is the individualism rampant in our society. We have moved "from "us" to "me"" thinking that we don't need anyone to save us, to ground us in goodness. I believe that grandparents and the elderly are essential to pass on the faith we have received and to sustain all of us by prayer and example. The wisdom of those who have lived to their senior years is indispensable.

I am grateful to our Catholic Grandparents Association for being with us this year at our 10AM Mass to celebrate this day. The Catholic Grandparents meet monthly to support one another in passing on the faith to the young, deepening their own spirituality, and encouraging one another. All are welcome to take part.

Pro Life Ministry

Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances (FACE) Act of 1994

Legislation sponsored by the late Sen. Ted Kennedy has been used to put pro-life advocates in prison for blocking abortion mills through a variety of methods such as lying down, chaining themselves, and saying the rosary; all with the intent of stopping that day's abortions and saving babies' lives. Everything they did was non-violent. This summer a number of prolife folks have been sentenced to probation, and many to prison sentences ranging from six months to five years.

Our parish pro-life committee has written letters to the judge on behalf of a number of pro-life defendants. And recently, on behalf of the parish, we made a \$250 contribution for the defense of these folks to the Thomas More Society, a not-for-profit legal team that defends pro-life causes. That money came from you, the parishioners of St. John Neumann Parish. On behalf of those undergoing persecution for speaking out for the unborn of our nation, we thank you.

Additionally, we ask you to remember these people in your prayers. And pray especially the Bishop Sheen daily prayer, copies of which we have handed out and are available in the vestibule.

Interestingly, the FACE act also includes in its legislation:

"or intentionally damaging or destroying the property of a place of religious worship."

The question has to be asked: where were these dedicated agencies when our St. Raymond campus was undergoing a series of vandalism incidents just a short two years ago?
