Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

This past week was the one year anniversary of the beginning of the Hamas-Israel-Hezbollah war in the Middle East. This past Monday, the anniversary of the Hamas attack was declared a day of prayer and penance for peace. Here are some excerpts from a recent pastoral letter from +Pierbattista Cardinal Pizzaballa, the Patriarch of Jerusalem:

We too have a duty to commit ourselves to peace, first by preserving our hearts from all feelings of hatred, and instead cherishing the desire for good for everyone. By committing ourselves, each in our own community contexts and in the forms we can, we should support those in need, help those who are personally invested to alleviate the suffering of those affected by this war, and promote every action of peace, reconciliation and encounter.

Yet, we also need to pray, to bring our pain and our desire for peace to God. We need to convert, to do penance, and to implore forgiveness. From <https://www.lpj.org/en/news/a-day-of-prayer-fasting-and-penance>

Note that he said we must first find peace in our own hearts. The evil that we feel within ourselves must be rooted out. Then we can begin to support those in need and to work and pray for the lasting peace that only Christ can bring.

PRO-LIFE MINISTRY



On Thursday, Sept. 26th, a number of St. John Neumann parishioners attended the inaugural March for Life in Trenton. With the overturn of Roe, the state capitols have become the focal point of the fight to save the lives of unborn babies. And to our shame, NJ has the most liberal abortion laws in the country.

There was a Mass in Trenton at St. Mary of the Assumption Cathedral at 9:30am, followed by a rally at the state capitol from 11am-12 noon. The speakers were from the legislature as well as the pro-life movement. Lots of cheering and lots of signs! Then the march began which lasted about an hour and had a fairly large crowd that stretched for blocks. Many students from high schools were involved as well as priests and nuns from all over and, of course, many mothers pushing baby carriages decorated with pro-life signs. And we certainly cannot forget the Knights of Columbus who sponsored our bus and played a key role in the day's activities. Numerous councils were involved as well as members from our own council #3546.

At the Mass, the homily was delivered by Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M. of Trenton and, in an excerpt, he said the following:

“As Catholics we are pro-life. How can a Catholic be otherwise? And yet, we see in our day people, even some who self-identify as Catholic, some who hold the highest positions in government, who not only are NOT pro-life but who work against that conviction, who vigorously support a contrary position, who tragically seek to support even more legislation that enables the destruction of life at its most vulnerable stage: in the womb. The dying cries of the innocent children call out to them. God will be their judge”.

Amen to that!

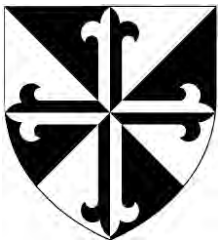


The Catholic Grandparents' ministry builds a community of support for grandparents and equips them with tools to bring their families closer

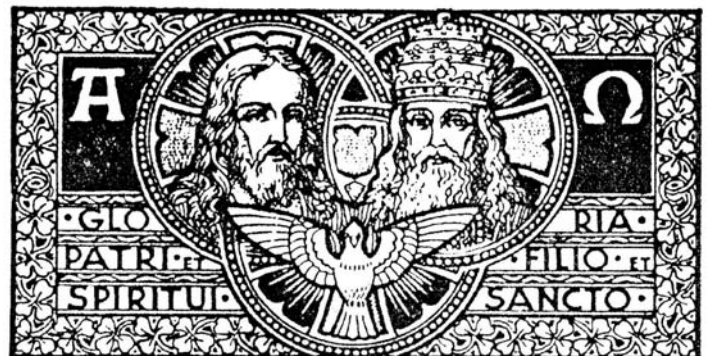

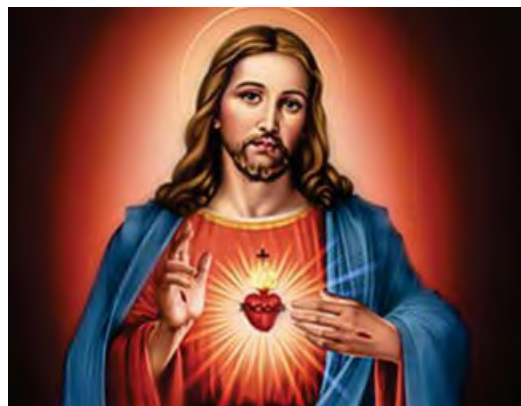
