Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

Glory to Jesus Christ!

Well, the National Election is this week. As is well documented, Pope Francis has called this election a choice between “two evils.” Both candidates are deeply flawed. Neither of them seems to believe in the absolute dignity of the human person from conception to natural death. However, most people are able, for themselves, to identify one that is “better” or “worse” than the other. Additionally, some people have chosen to vote for third party candidates who better reflect positions that are closer to what they personally believe.

I draw your attention to the document Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship by the US Conference of Catholic Bishops. The entire text can be found at USCCB.ORG, and searching for “Faithful Citizenship.”

Participation in political life also requires judgments about concrete circumstances. While the bishops help form the laity in accordance with basic principles, they do not tell the laity to vote for particular candidates. On these often complex matters, it is the laity's responsibility to form their consciences and grow in the virtue of prudence to approach the many and varied issues of the day with the mind of Christ. Conscience is “a judgment of reason” by which one determines whether an action is right or wrong (CCC, no. 1778). It does not allow us to justify doing whatever we want, nor is it a mere “feeling.” Conscience—properly formed according to God's revelation and the teaching of the Church—is a means by which one listens to God and discerns how to act in accordance with the truth. The truth is something we receive, not something we make. We can only judge using the conscience we have, but our judgments do not make things true.

It is our responsibility to learn more of Catholic teaching and tradition, to participate in Church life, to learn from trustworthy sources about the issues facing our communities, and to do our best to make wise judgments about candidates and government actions.

May God bless each of us this week. And God bless America.

Pro-Life Ministry

The Commercial on the "View"



Recently a Pro-Life ad ran on ABC during the show "The View" which depicted graphic images of aborted children. Yes, they are children, and yes, as Pope John Paul II stated in *Evangelium Vitae* 58 and our Catholic Catechism agrees, abortion is the murder or taking of an innocent life. And that life is of one most defenseless, the child within the womb.

The commercial was able to run on TV due to the sponsor, Randall Terry, a committed pro-lifer and a presidential candidate, having the right to air it as part of his campaign. I recommend you view this commercial on **YouTube Stupid Celebrities, Lying Journalists**—but remember, it is tough to watch. The truth sometimes is that way.

I often stand on picket lines and I always carry the signs with the cute babies, but never the signs that show graphic results of abortion. Not in the open public. And I certainly would not run the ad during children's programming. But during the View? Bingo! And the reactions have been strong against it from the usual corners. CNN called it "outrageous, antisemitic, and dangerous." Now, I just wonder if they thought how dangerous abortion is to the child in the womb. But of course not, because to them it is only a clump of cells. Or so they tell themselves.

Many who support abortion have no desire to see the end product, which is a lifeless child. But not here, because no one can claim those aborted babies on that table in that ad were anything but life when you see them. A gift from God that had as much right as you and me to grow, go to school, go to the prom, work, to love and be loved. And perhaps get married and have their own children someday. Simply to have the life that God intended. Those for abortion can yell all they want about this ad but "methinks they protest too much." When faced with this ad, they now know that they are taking human life, and with that knowledge there can be no more excuses that "I didn't know" or it was "just a clump of cells." And with that knowledge comes the moral responsibility to defend life in every way possible.

And I have to give credit to the Knights of Columbus who help sponsor ultra sound machines next to the abortion clinics. One look at the baby on the screen and many expectant mothers walk away from their appointment with the abortion mill. But that doesn't end our support of the mother and the baby at all. Many of our organizations in our parish have been active in financial and material support for mothers and their newborns. Thank you and God Bless all who choose life!

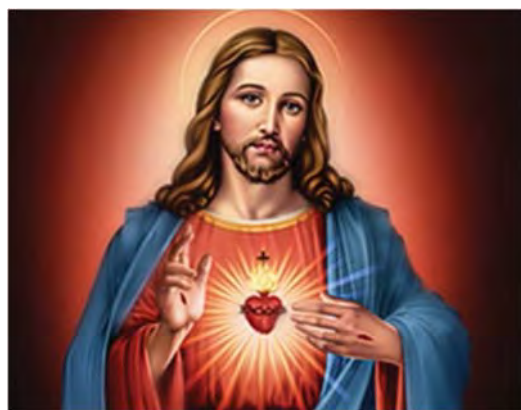

La Penitencia y absolución

Es lo que el padre te dice y debe hacer, al que se confiesa, para reparar el daño que hiciste por tu pecado. Después el Padre te dice “Yo te absuelvo de tus pecados en el nombre del Padre y del Hijo y de Espíritu Santo.

No tengas miedo el Señor te ha creado y te ama más que puedes entender o imaginar.

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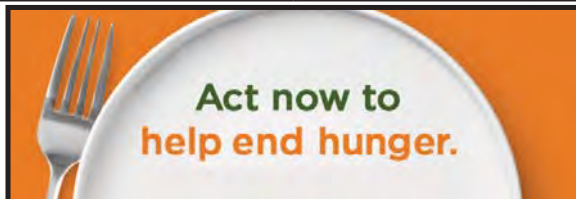
