

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

Glory to Jesus Christ!

Next weekend we will begin a new liturgical year. On a mundane level, this means that we will have new missalettes at St. Raymond and at daily Mass. We ask you kindly to not "borrow" a missalette and take it home: they are for the use of the whole community. Doing so has a name: it's called "stealing." We will have missalettes available for purchase if anyone wants them. We are asking \$10 per book. Please inquire at the parish office. The readings are also available online; many parishioners have subscriptions to *Magnificat* or *The Word Among Us*. Others buy a *St. Joseph Missal* every year to use.

This is also an opportunity to think about the proclamation of the Word of God at Mass. The Bishops of the United States in their document Hearing the Word of God remind us that: "We are called to listen attentively as the reader, deacon or priest proclaims God's Word. Unless one is unable to hear, one should not be reading along with a text from a missal or missalette. Rather, taking our cue from the General Instruction itself, we should listen as we would if Christ himself were standing at the ambo for, in fact, it is God who speaks when the Scriptures are proclaimed. Carefully following along with the printed word can cause us to miss the gentle voice of the Holy Spirit, the message that the Spirit may have for us in one of the passages - because we are anxious to "keep up," to move along with the reader. The bishops quote St. John Paul II in saying that "those who take part in the Eucharist—priest, ministers and faithful... to prepare the Sunday liturgy, reflecting beforehand upon the word of God which will be proclaimed." Perhaps for the next year we can make it a point to read the readings **before** Mass begins, either in the pew or at home, and then listen attentively to the Proclamation of the Word of God.






