

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

The Christ Child Society's "Giving Tree" is now in the vestibules of St. Raymond and St. John of God churches. The gifts





Pro Life Ministry

Our Lady of Guadalupe: Patroness of the Americas and of the Unborn

On December 12th we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. It would be impossible to tell her full story here, but we strongly suggest you find her story online. Her apparition to Juan Diego in 1531 and her subsequent miraculous image on his tilma (coat) were accompanied by some of the most moving words of comfort ever heard from our Mother:



"Listen, and let it penetrate your heart, my dear little son; do not be troubled or weighted down with grief. Do not fear any illness or vexation, anxiety, or pain," Our Lady of Guadalupe is quoted as saying to Juan Diego. "Am I not here who am your mother? Are you not under my shadow and protection? Am I not your fountain of life? Are you not in the folds of my mantle? In the crossing of my arms? Is there anything else you need?"

What makes this apparition special to us in the prolife community is Mary's wearing of the black sash traditionally worn to indicate pregnancy in the native culture. It is humbling to know that in this image the Unborn Infant Jesus lies safely within His Mother's womb. In 2018, Pope Francis entrusted to Our Lady of Guadalupe "in particular, those who are awaiting the birth of their children."

And, as such, our spiritual babies reach full term on December 25th. We began the Bishop Sheen Spiritual Adoption on March 25th, the Feast of the Annunciation. We will not meet these "spiritually adopted" children in this world, but we can remember them by helping other children and their mothers who chose life for them by giving to the Christ Child Society during this blessed season. In the vestibule you will find the "giving tree" - please consider helping these children.

The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a Holy Day of Obligation. It falls on a Sunday this year, but is transferred to Monday, December 9th. There is no Vigil Mass on Sunday. Mass on the Feast Day will be celebrated at 9am at St. John of God and at 7pm at St. Raymond (Spanish).

THE HOLY NAME SOCIETY



The Holy Name Society in our parish is part of the National Holy Name Society organization and is open to Catholic men of all ages. The main obligations of

each member is to promote reverence for the sacred names of God and Jesus. The essential obligation of a Holy Name member might be summed up in the first petition of the Our Father, "Hallowed be thy name." Our members are active in many of our parish ministries and, as an organization, we help support other ministries. The Chapter meets **the first Wednesday of the month at 2pm** in the large meeting room at St. John of God campus.

We also publicly proclaim our love for Jesus Christ by attending Mass and receiving Holy Communion as a group at the 10am Mass on the second Sunday of each month at St. John of God.




