Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION

- Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

Glory to Jesus Christ!

This week we celebrate two wonder-
ful Marian Feasts: The Immaculate

Conception and Our Lady of Guadalupe. The Immaculate Conception is the anniversary of when the Blessed Mother was herself immaculately conceived by her parents, Saints Joachim and Anne. This is an ancient feast of the Church but was not formally proclaimed as a Dogma until 1854. Both our Diocese of Camden as well as the entire Church in America has Mary Immaculate as our patroness. The two primary devotions to Our Lady under this title are the Miraculous Medal and the Green Scapular. If you have/wear one of these and don't know the history, please look it up! I hope to include a blurb about the Miraculous Medal next week.

Our Lady of Guadalupe is the patroness of Mexico and the American Continent. She appeared to St. Juan Diego in the year 1531 and has been the source of conversion and devotion for millions. I have been blessed to visit 7 major Marian Shrines around the world and Guadalupe was by far the most moving.

For the Holy Day of the Immaculate Conception (Obligatory) we have English Masses at St. John of God at 9am, and 5pm at St. Raymond; also a 7pm Spanish Mass at St. Raymond. For Our Lady of Guadalupe we have Las Mañanitas (morning praise and rosary in Spanish) at 5am at St. Raymond, 9am Mass in English at St. John of God, a car procession from St. John to St. Raymond at 4pm (please arrive by 3:30pm) and Mass at 6pm (Spanish) at St. Raymond followed by the party. (Times are approximate.) God bless you as we celebrate our Lady!

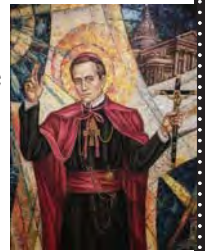

We will start off the new year right as a parish family! It's the feast day of St. John Neumann on **Sunday, January 5th**, and we plan to celebrate our patron

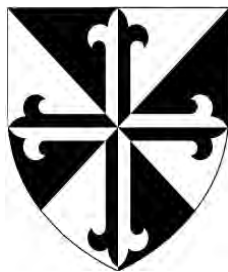

Pro Life Ministry

Our Lady of Guadalupe: Patroness of the Americas and of the Unborn

On December 12th we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. It would be impossible to tell her full story here, but we strongly suggest you find her story online. Her apparition to Juan Diego in 1531 and her subsequent miraculous image on his tilma (coat) were accompanied by some of the most moving words of comfort ever heard from our Mother:



"Listen, and let it penetrate your heart, my dear little son; do not be troubled or weighted down with grief. Do not fear any illness or vexation, anxiety, or pain," Our Lady of Guadalupe is quoted as saying to Juan Diego. "Am I not here who am your mother? Are you not under my shadow and protection? Am I not your fountain of life? Are you not in the folds of my mantle? In the crossing of my arms? Is there anything else you need?"

What makes this apparition special to us in the pro-life community is Mary's wearing of the black sash traditionally worn to indicate pregnancy in the native culture. It is humbling to know that in this image the Unborn Infant Jesus lies safely within His Mother's womb. In 2018, Pope Francis entrusted to Our Lady of Guadalupe "in particular, those who are awaiting the birth of their children."

And, as such, our spiritual babies reach full term on December 25th. We began the Bishop Sheen Spiritual Adoption on March 25th, the Feast of the Annunciation. We will not meet these "spiritually adopted" children in this world, but we can remember them by helping other children and their mothers who chose life for them by giving to the Christ Child Society during this blessed season. In the vestibule you will find the "giving tree" - please consider helping these children.

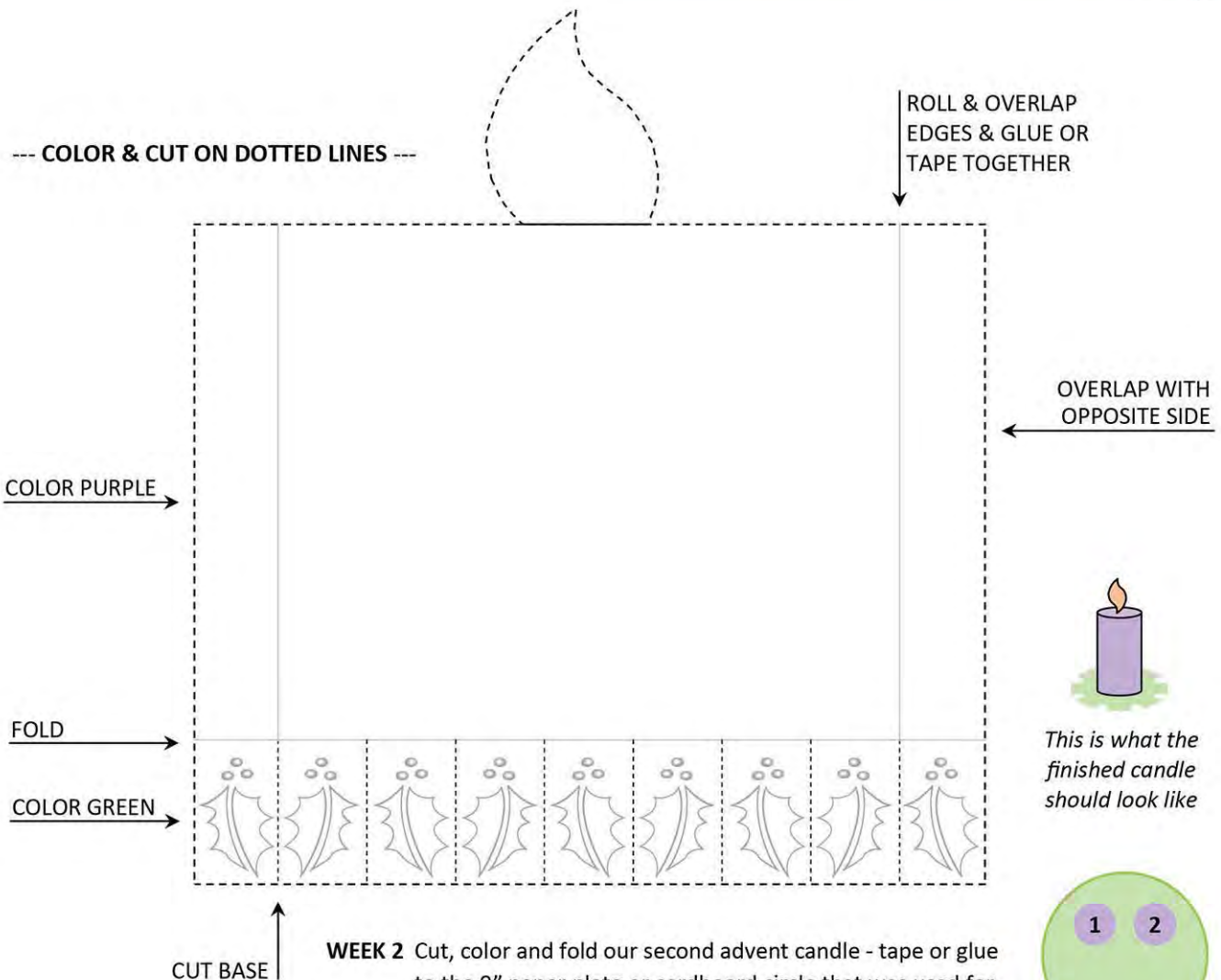

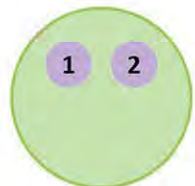
Oldest child lights 2 purple candles.

¿QUE ES EL ADVIENTO?

- La palabra Adviento es de origen latino y quiere decir: **VENIDA**.

- Veré que una vez con el alma limpia, estaré mucho mejor dispuesto para seguir con los preparativos.

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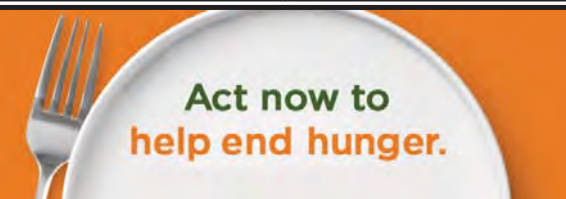
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
