Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION

- Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

Glory to Jesus Christ!

Last week we celebrated 3 Marian Feasts (I forgot to mention Our Lady of Loretto). As we continue to contemplate our Blessed Mother and her role in the Incarnation of Our Lord, we reflect on the prayers of the Miraculous Medal. Many people wear this medal but don't know too much about it.

On July 18 and November 27, 1830, St. Catherine Laboure, a French nun, had a vision of the Blessed Mother who showed her the medal as we know it today. She asked that the medal be created and said that all who wear it would receive great graces.

Almighty and merciful God, who by the many appearances on earth of the Immaculate Virgin Mary were pleased to work miracles again and again for the salvation of souls; kindly pour out your blessing on this medal, so that all who devoutly wear it and reverence it may experience the patronage of Mary Immaculate and obtain mercy from you; through Jesus Christ.

Then the priest instructs the person thus: Take this Holy Medal, wear it with faith, and handle it with due devotion, so that the holy and immaculate Queen of heaven may protect and defend you. And as she is ever ready to renew her wondrous acts of kindness, may she obtain for you in her mercy whatever you humbly ask of God, so that both in life and in death you may rest happily in her motherly embrace.

When we wear a Miraculous Medal, or any other Christian signs, we are not just putting on jewelry, we are remembering our incorporation into Christ and renewing our commitments to Him. As we prepare in this third week of Advent, may we remember what we are doing to prepare to meet the Christ Child.

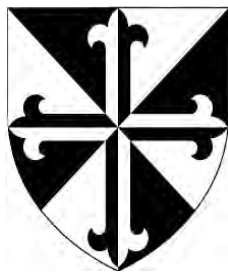
PARISH FEAST DAY PARTY

Christmas and Pro-Life

Mary had free will. She wasn't forced to go along with the plan that would result in the birth of our Savior. It's easy to get caught up in the story and ignore the fact that the Blessed Mother could have refused God's offer. According to the Vatican II document *Lumen Gentium*:



“The Father of mercies willed that the Incarnation should be preceded by assent on the part of the predestined mother, so that just as a woman (Eve) had a share in the coming of death, so also should a woman contribute to the coming of life.”

Saint Bernard of Clairvaux described the Annunciation as the “moment the angels in Heaven held their breath.” But Mary chose life, and God began to dwell with us as a child in His mother's womb nine months before His birth in a stable in Bethlehem. And so the angels could breathe again.

It is a tough sell to be pro-life in these days, but much tougher for the pregnant 18 or 19 year old girl who has just been thrown out of the house by her parents. We, as Catholics and followers of Christ, are called to help her in any way possible. Keep all of those facing these choices in your prayers this Christmas. But give also from your pocket and your heart to any pro-life agency such as Catholic Charities (609-886-2662) or to the Jersey Shore Women's Center (609-568-6551) and, of course, to our Christ Child Society's Giving Tree in the vestibule. You will never know who benefited from your generosity. At least not in this world.



Lector Ministry

The call to the ministry of Lector is a call to develop what Pope Paul VI described as a “warm and living love and knowledge of Scripture that will make the reader a more perfect disciple of the Lord.” Through the Mass we are nourished by God’s life-giving Word and His life-giving Body, therefore the Lector is challenged to study and prepare the Scripture they are to proclaim so that the listeners will recognize the beauty and meaning of the Word. The Lector is privileged to proclaim God’s Living Word, this Word that will endure forever, the Word that gives enlightenment, hope, and challenges to God’s people. A training and certification, one-day session is offered by the diocese for prospective Lectors. In-house practice is also available. 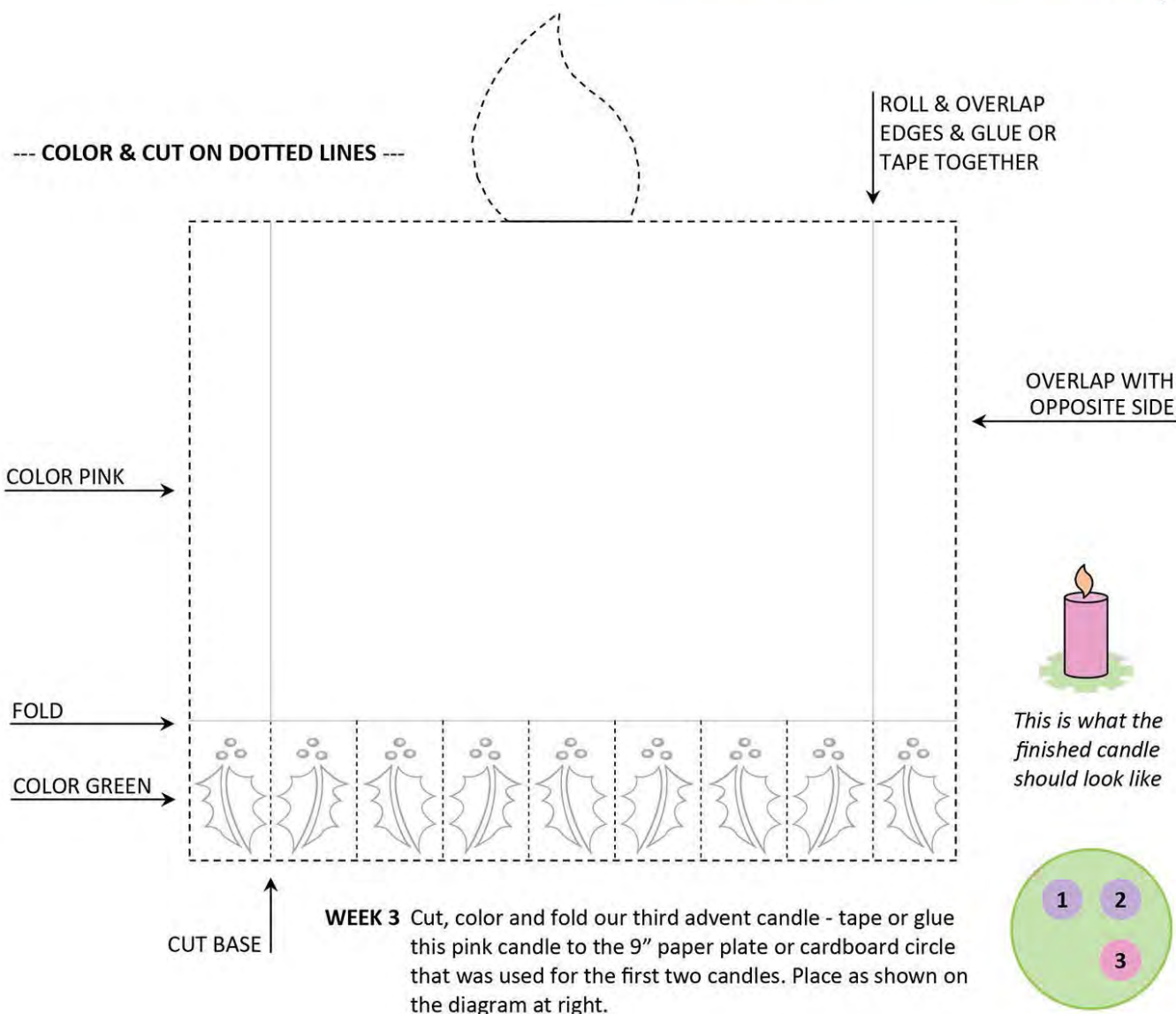
