RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. From Father King

From +Pope Benedict XVI, Christmas, 2012

"Where God is not glorified, where he is forgotten or even denied, there is no peace either. Nowadays, though, widespread currents of thought assert the exact opposite: they say that religions...are the cause of the violence and the wars in the world. If there is to be peace, humanity must first be liberated from them. ... While there is no denying a certain misuse of religion in history, yet it is not true that denial of God would lead to peace. If God's light is extinguished, man's divine dignity is also extinguished. Then the human creature would cease to be God's image, to which we must pay honour in every person, in the weak, in the immigrant, in the poor. Then we would no longer all be brothers and sisters, children of the one Father, who belong to one another on account of that one Father. The kind of arrogant violence that then arises, the way man then despises and tramples upon man: we saw this in all its cruelty in the last century. Only if God's light shines over man and within him, only if every single person is desired, known and loved by God is his dignity inviolable, however wretched his situation may be. On this Holy Night, God himself became man; as Isaiah prophesied, the child born here is "Emmanuel", God with us (Is 7:14). And down the centuries, while there has been misuse of religion, it is also true that forces of reconciliation and goodness have constantly sprung up from faith in the God who became man. Into the darkness of sin and violence, this faith has shone a bright ray of peace and goodness, which continues to shine."



Christmas and Pro-Life

Mary had free will. She wasn't forced to go along with the plan that would result in the birth of our Savior. It's easy to get caught up in the story and ignore the fact that the Blessed Mother could have refused God's of-



fer. According to the Vatican II document, Lumen Gentium: "The Father of mercies willed that the Incarnation should be preceded by assent on the part of the predestined mother, so that just as a woman (Eve) had a share in the coming of death, so also should a woman contribute to the coming of life." Saint Bernard of Clairvaux described the Annunciation as the "moment the angels in Heaven held their breath". But Mary chose life and God began to dwell with us as a child in His mother's womb nine months before His birth in a stable in Bethlehem. And so the angels could breathe again.

It is a tough sell to be pro-life in these days, but much tougher for the pregnant 18 or 19 year old girl who has just been thrown out of the house by her parents. We, as Catholics and followers of Christ, are called to help her in any way possible. Keep all of those facing these choices in your prayers this Christmas. THE HOLY NAME SOCIETY


The Holy Name Society in our parish is part of the National Holy Name Society organization and is open to Catholic men of all ages. The main obligations of each member is to promote


