Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

Here is another Pope Benedict quote, an excerpt from his homily on the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord, December 24, 2009:

God's sign is His humility. God's sign is that He makes Himself small; He becomes a child; He lets us touch Him and He asks for our love. How we would prefer a different sign, an imposing, irresistible sign of God's power and greatness! But His sign summons us to faith and love, and thus it gives us hope: this is what God is like. He has power; He is goodness itself. He invites us to become like Him. Yes indeed, we become like God if we allow ourselves to be shaped by this sign; if we ourselves learn humility and hence true greatness; if we renounce violence and use only the weapons of truth and love.

As we celebrate this feast of The Holy Family, may we also learn humility as we model the Holy Family of Nazareth.

Christmas and Pro-Life

Mary had free will. She wasn't forced to go along with the plan that would result in the birth of our Savior. It's easy to get caught up in the story and ignore the fact that the Blessed Mother could have refused God's offer.



According to the Vatican II document, *Lumen Gentium*: "The Father of mercies willed that the Incarnation should be preceded by assent on the part of the predestined mother, so that just as a woman (Eve) had a share in the coming of death, so also should a woman contribute to the coming of life." Saint Bernard of Clairvaux described the Annunciation as the "moment the angels in Heaven held their breath". But Mary chose life and God began to dwell with us as a child in His mother's womb nine months before His birth in a stable in Bethlehem. And so the angels could breathe again.

It is a tough sell to be pro-life in these days, but much tougher for the pregnant 18 or 19 year old girl who has just been thrown out of the house by her parents. We, as Catholics and followers of Christ, are called to help her in any way possible. Keep all of those facing these choices in your prayers this Christmas. But give also from your pocket and your heart to any pro-life agency such as Catholic Charities (609-886-2662) or to the Jersey Shore Women's Center (609-568-6551) and, of course, to our Christ Child Society's Giving Tree in the vestibule. You will never know who benefited from your generosity.

The handicapped will need to recess through the vestibule/entrance, but must wait until the church is clear before doing so. Let's be prepared so we won't be scared!

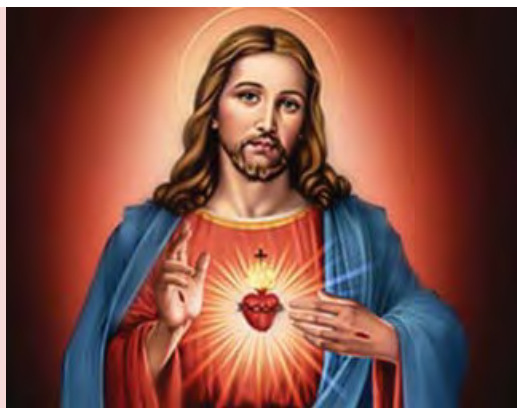

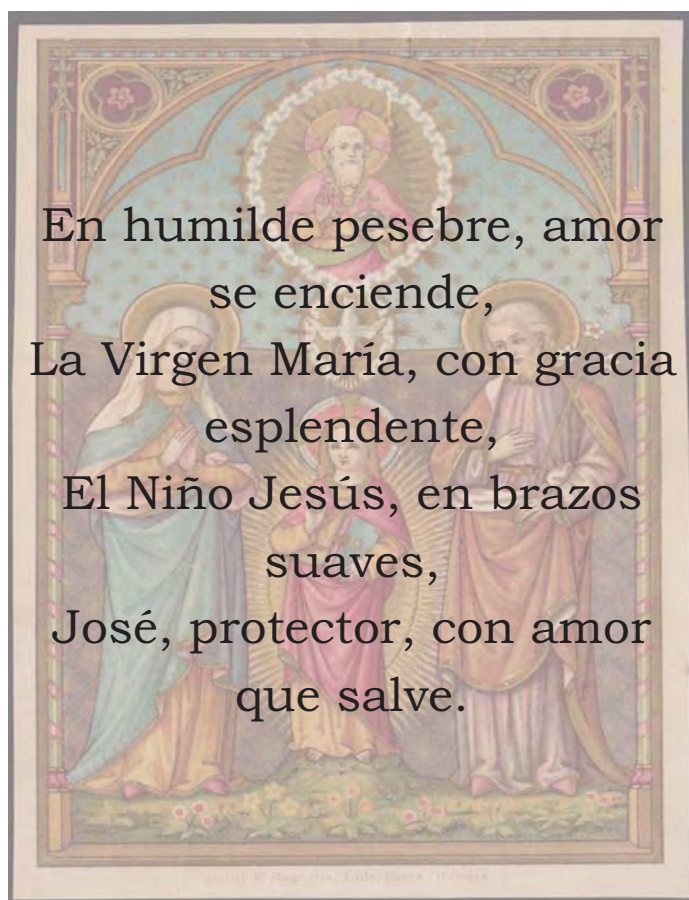
