

Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST

AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.





Christ is Born! Glorify Him!

Today, January 5th, is the Feast of the patron of our parish, St.

John Neumann, a 19th Century Redemptorist priest from Bohemia (Cech Republic) who became the 4th bishop of Philadelphia. After ministering diligently in Pennsylvania and a few locations in South Jersey, he died in 1860 at the age of 49. However, the Saint's work did not end there! The church has officially recognized three miracles that led to his canonization.

Eva Benassi, an eleven-year-old girl from Sassuolo, near Milan, Italy, was cured of tubercular peritonitis in May, 1923 after a nun placed a holy card/picture of the Bishop on her abdomen. In July, 1949, Kent Lenahan Jr. of Villanova, PA, was seriously injured in a car accident. Hospitalized with life threatening injuries, he then developed a 107 degree fever. After a piece of the Bishop's coffin was placed on him, the fever left and in a few days he was completely cured.

The final miracle hits even closer to home. In 1963, six-year-old Michael Flanigan of West Philly was given a terminal diagnosis of Ewing's sarcoma, an aggressive bone cancer. After taking the child to the Bishop's shrine and pinning a relic to his pajamas the cancer, which had spread through his body, was gone. Michael's family later moved to the Villas and were active members of St. Raymond. They spread devotion to St. John Neumann that led to the naming of our parish in his honor in 2012.

There are many other unofficial miracles of this great Saint. Let us continue to invoke his guidance and protection. St. John Neumann, pray for us!

Two More Inconvenient Truths

Ask yourself this question: When was the last time I thought about nuclear weapons?



If you're like most of us, you don't think about it at all. Yet the threat of nuclear war has existed since 1945. But it is a concept so horrific that we cope with it by convincing ourselves that it could never happen. But it could conceivably happen.

There is another concept that is just as horrific, and not only can it happen, it has happened every day for over fifty years, and the number of its victims dwarfs the total number of people who have died in wars since wars began.

Unlike the threat of nuclear war, we cannot convince ourselves that abortion doesn't exist, so we develop other coping mechanisms: It's just a clump of cells, it can't survive outside its mother's womb, it's not a person until it's born, it's my right to choose, and I would never have one, but I can't tell someone else what they can and cannot do.

All these defenses of abortion are possible only if we employ the same coping mechanism we use for nuclear war: It's too horrible to contemplate, so we choose to ignore it altogether, or rationalize it with the aforementioned excuses. And every day we choose to ignore it, and excuse it, the most innocent lives are terminated.

Che es la Octava de Navidad?

La Octava de Navidad es el tiempo que consta desde la Natividad de Jesús hasta el 1° de enero que se celebra la Solemnidad de María Madre de Dios.

Navidad comienza el día 24 de diciembre en la noche con la celebración de la llamada Misa de Gallo, que es la Misa de Navidad. A partir de ahí, por los ocho días siguientes, se celebra la Octava de Navidad. Esta celebración, que se hace extensiva por ocho días, es tomada de la costumbre judía de celebrar las fiestas religiosas más importantes —y el nacimiento de un niño— por este número de días simbólico para ellos. Por eso al igual que la Navidad la Pascua tiene su propia octava.

La Natividad del Señor celebra su primera venida, cuando Dios se hace pequeño y asume nuestra naturaleza humana. Ese día se puede celebrar tres Misas, según la antigua tradición romana, en la noche, a la aurora y en el día.

Después de la Natividad del Señor, la Octava se ordena de la siguiente manera:

El 26 de diciembre se recuerda a San Esteban, el protomártir, que dio la vida por anunciar a Cristo. Su vida podemos encontrarla en el libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles.

El 27 de diciembre se conmemora a discípulo amado, a San Juan, quien anunció desde su vivencia de fe que Dios es Amor. Para conocer su vida, pensamiento y apostolado podemos leer el Evangelio según San Juan y sus tres cartas apostólicas.

Los Santos Inocentes, el 28 de diciembre, celebra la memoria de los niños a los que mató el ciego furor de Herodes por causa de Jesús, se puede ver en el Evangelio según San Mateo. La tradición litúrgica los llama "Santos Inocentes" y los considera mártires. La Iglesia recuerda este día la innumerable multitud de niños no nacidos y asesinados al amparo de las leyes que permiten el aborto.

El segundo domingo de Navidad, la Iglesia celebra a la Sagrada Familia. Nos dice el Directorio sobre la Piedad Popular y la Liturgia: "El recuerdo de José, de María y del niño Jesús, que se dirigen a Jerusalén, como toda familia hebrea observante, para realizar los ritos de la Pascua, animará a que toda la familia acepte la invitación a participar unida, ese día, en la Eucaristía."

Por último, el 1° de enero se celebra a María Madre de Dios. Y con esta Solemnidad termina la octava de Navidad.

El tiempo de Navidad no acaba el 1° de enero, sino que va hasta el lunes después del Bautismo del Señor Jesús, 13 de Enero.
