

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST

AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.



Christ is Born! Glorify Him!

This Sunday we conclude the Christmas Season with the

Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Speaking with someone recently, they said to me, "Father, why do we celebrate Jesus' baptism after Christmas? He wasn't baptized as a baby...He was grown already!" And that is a good point. Why do we celebrate Jesus' Baptism during Christmas?

Last week we celebrated the Solemnity of the Epiphany. Though we in the Western (Roman) Church focus on the visit of the Magi, the Epiphany is really about God manifesting His presence in the world. The feast of Epiphany commemorates three events: the Visit of the Magi, the Baptism by John, and the Wedding of Cana. At each of these events there were visible and experiential signs of God's presence: a Star, the Voice of the Father and the Presence of the Dove, and the new Wine. At each of these manifestations the people could see and experience that something extraordinary had happened. These "signs" were different that the healings, exorcisms, feedings, and other miracles of Jesus.

I think all of us desire to experience tangible signs of God's presence, of His love. We want to see miracles. However, are we looking for "the miracles of God" or "the God of the miracles?" In other words, are we just looking for the fantastic or to see signs to increase our faith? As we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus and the revelation of the Holy Trinity today, take some time to remember the miracles that you have witnessed. What are the times that your faith has been strengthened? We give thanks for these "epiphanies" in our real lives.





Two More Inconvenient Truths

Ask yourself this question: When was the last time I thought about nuclear weapons?



If you're like most of us, you don't think about it at all. Yet the threat of nuclear war has existed since 1945. But it is a concept so horrific that we cope with it by convincing ourselves that it could never happen. But it could conceivably happen.

There is another concept that is just as horrific, and not only can it happen, it has happened every day for over fifty years, and the number of its victims dwarfs the total number of people who have died in wars since wars began.

Unlike the threat of nuclear war, we cannot convince ourselves that abortion doesn't exist, so we develop other coping mechanisms: It's just a clump of cells, it can't survive outside its mother's womb, it's not a person until it's born, it's my right to choose, and I would never have one, but I can't tell someone else what they can and cannot do.

All these defenses of abortion are possible only if we employ the same coping mechanism we use for nuclear war: It's too horrible to contemplate, so we choose to ignore it altogether, or rationalize it with the aforementioned excuses. And every day we choose to ignore it, and excuse it, the most innocent lives are terminated.
