

Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST

AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

Christ is Born! Glorify Him!

Today we hear the beautiful reading of the Wedding Feast of Cana. This reading reminds us also of the great

dignity of the sacrament of Matrimony. It is the law of the Catholic Church that only those who are married by an ordained Catholic deacon or priest are considered validly married (unless dispensed by the bishop). What does this mean and why does the Church require it?

The Church teaches that Jesus raised the natural act of marriage to the dignity of a Sacrament. Sacraments are those outward signs, instituted by Christ, that confer divine grace. Therefore for a Catholic to get married, he or she must be properly prepared to live out this sacrament. When I felt called to be a priest, I couldn't just go to the Bishop and ask him to ordain me; I needed to be formed! It took me 11 years of study and guidance to become a priest! Certainly, it doesn't take this long for someone to prepare for marriage but it does require some time. Also, the Sacrament of Marriage is a solemn and public commitment. Like all other solemn and public Church commitments, it is to take place in Church (unless it is done in an emergency situation). Baptisms, Confirmations, First Communions, and Ordi-

nations are all celebrated in Church, and so must Weddings. That is one of the reasons that those who are not married by permission of the Church cannot serve as godparents or Confirmation sponsors.



Unfortunately, Marriage is not seen the same way it once was in our culture and world. Most no longer consider it a permanent, exclusive relationship between husband and wife for mutual well-being and the raising of children. This was the understanding of this Sacrament that was understood at the time of Jesus and the early Church. Today, as we celebrate Jesus at the Wedding of Cana, may we also pray for a strengthening of Christian Marriage.

Parish Pro-Life Committee

PARDON ME!



Mr. President-elect Trump, please don't forget those case reviews and pardons promised to Pro-Life protesters who spent the holidays in prison or awaiting sentencing! There are at least a dozen pro-lifers who were convicted of obstructing access to abortion clinics by such "outrageous" crimes as singing hymns or praying inside the abortion clinic. The past administration under the Justice Department used the notorious FACE Act to intimidate and arrest protesters seeking to save the lives of unborn children in abortion mills at various locations in our nation. Paulette Harlow, Joan Bell, and Jean Marshall, all over 75, have been given sentences of 24-27 months and currently are sitting in prison. One woman, Lauren Handy has been given a sentence of almost 5 years! (And think of the pardons already given out by our government!) And we will not abandon them. As previously noted, we have sent letters on their behalf to the sentencing judges, as well as contributing financially to the St. Thomas More Defense Fund which represents them at no cost.

According to the National Catholic Review, President-elect Trump has given indication on at least two occasions that he intends to review these cases immediately upon taking office, and pardon these courageous folks and return them to their families. He has pledged "to get them out of the gulags and back to their families where they belong." Someday, when this country comes to its senses and recognizes abortion as the taking of an innocent life, as **we**Catholics do, the FACE Act will be repealed and seen in the same light as the Fugitive Slave Acts of the mid 1800s that mandated the return of slaves.

And on that day, with the repeal of FACE, another stain on our nation's history will be blotted out.

Until that day, we can only hope that in January, Mr. President, "let the good pardons roll!" Amen!





Así somos, el Papa Francisco nos dio ese nombre para que nos demos cuenta de nuestra responsabilidad de ser Discípulos Misioneros de Jesucristo en una forma muy especial.



El logo representa cuatro figuras estilizadas que indican la humanidad proveniente desde los cuatro rincones de la tierra. Abrazadas entre ellas, indican la solidaridad y la fraternidad que une a los pueblos. La primera figura está aferrada a la cruz. Es el signo no solo de la fe que abraza, sino también de la esperanza que nunca puede ser abandonada, porque necesitamos siempre de ella, sobre todo en los momentos de mayor necesidad. Es útil observar las olas que la rodean y que están en movimiento, porque muestran que la peregrinación de la vida no siempre pasa por aguas tranquilas. Muchas veces las experiencias personales y los eventos del mundo exigen con mayor intensidad el llamado a la esperanza. Es por esto que se debe subrayar la parte inferior de la cruz que se alarga transformándose en un ancla y que se impone sobre el movimiento de las olas. Bien sabemos que el ancla ha sido usada como metáfora de la esperanza. De hecho, el ancla de la esperanza es el nombre que en la jerga marina se da al ancla de reserva usada por las embarcaciones para hacer maniobras de emergencia que permitan estabilizar la barca durante las tormentas. No se olvide el hecho de que la imagen muestra cómo el camino del peregrino no es un hecho individual, sino comunitario con la impronta de un dinamismo en crecimiento que tiende cada vez más hacia la cruz. La cruz no es estática, sino dinámica y se curva hacia la humanidad, saliendo a su encuentro y no dejándola sola, ofreciendo la certeza de la presencia y la seguridad de la esperanza. Se destaca, finalmente, con color verde el lema del jubileo 2025: Peregrinos de Esperanza.
