

St. Raymond Organ Update:

As you may have noticed our music director, Jim Blank, has been playing an electric piano/organ for our Masses at St. Raymond Church for over a month now. The organ at St. Raymond was original to the "new" church, installed in April, 1979. Since that time the organ has had several repairs. In November last year (2024), one of the circuit boards went down and we were able to have it repaired for \$1,039.75. Several weeks later the "motherboard" went down. It is currently in the Allen Organ repair shop. The estimated repair cost is \$3,449.40. Hopefully this repair will give us a few more months/years of liturgical music!

This week Jim Blank and I met with a local, reputable organ dealer to see what our options are going forward. A "middle of the road" new instrument will cost ~\$65,000. A "great" one would be ~\$95,000. There is also the possibility of purchasing a used instrument for ~\$50,000 with the hopes that we could then trade that in at a later date for credit toward something new.

As you know our buildings are aging. Both our churches are in need of significant renovations: new flooring, new/refurbished pews, painting, some work in the sanctuaries. In talks with the finance council this week, we brought up the idea of a capital campaign sometime in the next 2 years. Our parish is in good financial position: we do have some money in the bank. However, it is good financial planning to keep that money for new roofs, parking lot repaving, and any other emergency repairs.

I thank all of you for your continued prayerful and financial support of our parish!


Yes, we are continuing to collect coats!




Basics for Catholics: A

Mr. President-elect Trump, please don't forget those case reviews and pardons



promised to Pro-Life protesters who spent the holidays in prison or awaiting sentencing! There are at least a dozen pro-lifers who were convicted of obstructing access to abortion clinics by such "outrageous" crimes as singing hymns or praying inside the abortion clinic. The past administration under the Justice Department used the notorious FACE Act to intimidate and arrest protesters seeking to save the lives of unborn children in abortion mills at various locations in our nation. Paulette Harlow, Joan Bell, and Jean Marshall, all over 75, have been given sentences of 24-27 months and currently are sitting in prison. One woman, Lauren Handy has been given a sentence of almost 5 years! (And think of the pardons already given out by our government!) And we will not abandon them. As previously noted, we have sent letters on their behalf to the sentencing judges, as well as contributing financially to the St. Thomas More Defense Fund which represents them at no cost.





Por Diego López Marina — Durante este Año Santo de la Esperanza la Iglesia nos ofrece una Indulgencia Plenaria. ¿Qué es una indulgencia Plenaria?

Una indulgencia plenaria es una gracia de la Iglesia Católica que quita las penas temporales que se deben a los pecados ya perdonados. Es una especie de "reinicio" espiritual que permite al alma regresar al estado en el que se encontraba al ser bautizada.

La indulgencia plenaria no perdona los pecados en sí mismos, sino que libera a la persona de las consecuencias de los pecados, ya sea en la tierra o en el purgatorio. Se puede solicitar para uno mismo o para el alma de un difunto, pero no para alguien vivo.



Por ejemplo:


