

Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST

AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

In 1997 Pope St. John Paul II designed today, February 2, as the World Day of Prayer for


There are receptacles in the vestibules of our churches in

Did you know...

that social isolation and loneliness can have serious effects on mental health, especially among seniors? These include:

- Higher risks for physical and mental conditions such as high blood pressure, heart disease, obesity, anxiety, depression, cognitive decline.
- Mental illness, high stress, poor sleep, cognitive challenges, suicidal thoughts, and poor self-care.
- Major impact on quality of life.

From a demographic perspective, we are an ageing parish and many of us face challenges alone as we get older; challenges difficult enough when we have others living with us at home, but all the more difficult living alone. Isolation can be deadly, but there is help right here in Lower Township at the Lower Cape Senior Center located at 2612 Bayshore Road (right next to town hall). They have lots of programs here including Pokeno, chair aerobics, wood carving, painting, a pool table, and they even serve a nutritious \$2 lunch. And transportation is simple: you can be picked up and brought home by Cape May Fare Free (609-889-3700). But most of all, you will find people that you can socialize with, and we even saw folks from our parish there when we visited.
