Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION

- Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

Glory to Jesus Christ!

In 1997 Pope St. John Paul II designed today, February 2, as the World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life. As we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation, and that Jesus is the “Light of Revelation to the Nations” so, too, those who live a life of Consecrated poverty, chastity, and obedience are a light for our world today.

I remember at my ordination reception an elderly priest, himself a monk, was seated next to a younger Sister of St. Joseph. I saw that they were in deep conversation. The priest said to me when I came over to him, “her Sisters taught me to *read!*” This is true for so many. Consecrated women and men, Sisters, Brothers, Monks, and Nuns are responsible for being some of the most formative teachers and examples of our faith. They taught us to read and write, add and subtract. They taught us catechism and showed us the life of Christ with their actions.

At our parish we are blessed to have the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, missioned at St. Raymond convent. Sr. Anne and Sr. Marie work primarily with our Latino Community and Sr. Kathleen and Sr. JoAnna work with our religious education program. The sisters also instruct those becoming Catholic, run our Soup’s On! ministry and many other activities in our parish. We are also blessed to have living in our parish and close by Sisters of Mercy, Sisters of St. Joseph, Sisters of Christian Charity and others.

Today, please pray for the Religious in our parish and in your life. Thank God for the gift of religious life and ask our Lord to continue to send us many more men and women religious from our community.

which we ask you to place your new or clean, gently used coat donations (all sizes) for those less fortunate. Please check pockets before donating, and thank you so much for your generosity!



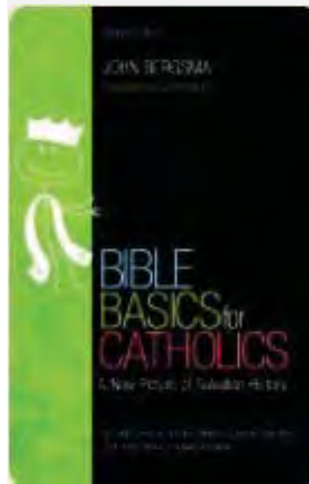

Did you know...

that social isolation and loneliness can have serious effects on mental health, especially among seniors? These include:

- Higher risks for physical and mental conditions such as high blood pressure, heart disease, obesity, anxiety, depression, cognitive decline.
- Mental illness, high stress, poor sleep, cognitive challenges, suicidal thoughts, and poor self-care.
- Major impact on quality of life.

From a demographic perspective, we are an ageing parish and many of us face challenges alone as we get older; challenges difficult enough when we have others living with us at home, but all the more difficult living alone. Isolation can be deadly, but there is help right here in Lower Township at the **Lower Cape Senior Center** located at 2612 Bayshore Road (right next to town hall). They have lots of programs here including Pokeno, chair aerobics, wood carving, painting, a pool table, and they even serve a nutritious \$2 lunch. And transportation is simple: you can be picked up and brought home by Cape May Fare Free (609-889-3700). But most of all, you will find people that you can socialize with, and we even saw folks from our parish there when we visited.

The Presentation of the Lord

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (paragraph 529) teaches:

The *presentation of Jesus in the temple* shows him to be the firstborn Son who belongs to the Lord. With Simeon and Anna, all Israel awaits its *encounter* with the Savior – the name given



to this event in the Byzantine tradition. Jesus is recognized as the long-expected Messiah, the “light to the nations” and the “glory of Israel,” but also “a sign that is spoken against.” The sword of sorrow predicted for Mary announces Christ’s perfect and unique oblation on the cross that will impart the salvation God had “prepared in the presence of all peoples.”

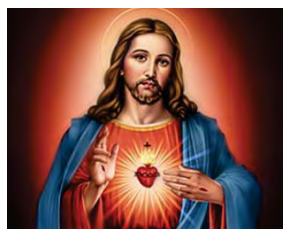

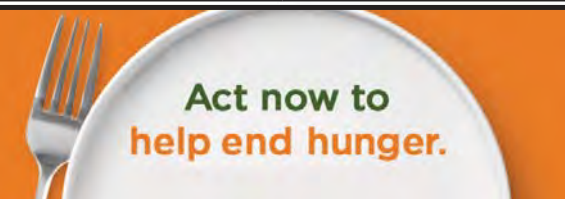
