

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.



This week we are working on ordering the Paschal Candles and other supplies for Lent and Easter. Though that seems like quite some time away, it isn't too soon to begin thinking about Lent. (Ash Wednesday is March 5th this year!)

The parish will have various offerings again this year. Stations of the Cross will be prayed in English at St. John of God Church: Each Friday of Lent at 8:20 AM and 7:00 PM. They will be prayed in Spanish on Friday evenings at St. Raymond.

On the Saturdays of Lent we will again have Soup and Scripture at 5:30 PM (after the Sunday Vigil Mass). Fr. Cesar and I will be presenting "7 Gifts in 6 Weeks: The Gifts of the Holy Spirit." 

Pro Life Ministry

"Today, freedom rings in our great nation." (Steve Crampton, Thomas More Society Senior Counsel)

Will Goodman, in jail since August 29, 2023, after he and other pro-lifers were convicted of violating the FACE Act for handing out pro-life brochures inside a Washington, DC abortion clinic, spoke of the moment he was pardoned after 17 months in prison:



"And though the cell block is normally very noisy, it got real quiet," he said. "Then I hear an inmate yell down, 'Did you get pardoned, Will?' I responded (yelling), 'Trump just pardoned me!' and all 60 guys started cheering and applauding. It was just really surreal," he recalled with joyous laughter.

We have written in this bulletin of those imprisoned for living their Faith and fighting the evil of abortion, and how the government has used the FACE Act to prosecute those seeking to preserve the lives of unborn children. And that we here in our parish have written letters on their behalf, and that we have contributed some of our parishioners' donations to help fund their defense. Now we can happily report that on Jan. 23rd, the day before the March for Life in Washington, President Trump granted pardons to 23 pro-life advocates in prison. Among those released: grandparents, mothers of young children, pastors, a Holocaust survivor (89 years old), and a Catholic priest, all prosecuted for non-violent protests at abortion clinics.

Yet not one of the 436 attacks on churches in 2023 were prosecuted under the FACE Act (and not for the attacks at St. Raymond in July 2022). But there is a light in the tunnel. Rep. Chip Roy (Texas) has introduced legislation to repeal the FACE Act, and this measure has been gaining support in the House and in the Senate led by Sen. Mike Lee (Utah). Pray for their success, and always remember your Bishop Sheen prayer to end abortion.

And so, Mr. Goodman, what was it like to be able to go to church again?

"Just being in church, entering into the liturgy, was like walking into the vestibule of Heaven".

Youth Trip to Washington, DC to Visit the Museum of the Bible


This state-of-the-art museum in the nation's capital focuses on the history, narrative, and impact of the Bible.

The standard Garden Permit Program includes a black standard plastic landscape edging for a fee of \$35. Submit an application for either of these options.
