Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION

- Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

Glory to Jesus Christ!

In his 2013 Message for Lent, Pope
Benedict XVI wrote:

“The celebration of Lent...offers us
a valuable opportunity to meditate on the relation-
ship between faith and charity: between believing in
God – the God of Jesus Christ – and love, which is
the fruit of the Holy Spirit and which guides us on
the path of devotion to God and others.

Faith as a response to the love of God

“In my first Encyclical, I offered some thoughts on
the close relationship between the theological virtues
of faith and charity. Setting out from Saint John’s
fundamental assertion: “We have come to know and
to believe in the love God has for us” (1 Jn 4:16), I
observed that “being Christian is not the result of an
ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with
an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon
and a decisive direction ... Since God has first loved
us (cf. 1 Jn 4:10), love is now no longer a mere
‘command’; it is the response to the gift of love with
which God draws near to us” (Deus Caritas Est, 1).
Faith is this personal adherence – which involves all
our faculties – to the revelation of God’s gratuitous
and “passionate” love for us, fully revealed in Jesus
Christ. The encounter with God who is Love engage-
es not only the heart but also the intellect:

“Acknowledgement of the living God is one path
towards love, and the ‘yes’ of our will to his will
unites our intellect, will and sentiments in the all-
embracing act of love. But this process is always
open-ended; love is never ‘finished’ and com-
plete” (ibid., 17). Hence, for all Christians, and espe-
cially for “charity workers”, there is a need for faith,
for “that encounter with God in Christ which awak-
ens their love and opens their spirits to others.”

My hope for you is to truly make the connection this
Lent between faith and love.

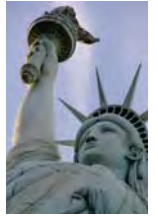

Pro Life Ministry

"Today, freedom rings in our great nation." (*Steve Crampton, Thomas More Society Senior Counsel*)

Will Goodman, in jail since August 29, 2023, after he and other pro-lifers were convicted of violating the FACE Act for handing out pro-life brochures inside a Washington, DC abortion clinic, spoke of the moment he was pardoned after 17 months in prison:



"And though the cell block is normally very noisy, it got real quiet," he said. "Then I hear an inmate yell down, 'Did you get pardoned, Will?' I responded (yelling), 'Trump just pardoned me!' and all 60 guys started cheering and applauding. It was just really surreal," he recalled with joyous laughter.

We have written in this bulletin of those imprisoned for living their Faith and fighting the evil of abortion, and how the government has used the FACE Act to prosecute those seeking to preserve the lives of unborn children. And that we here in our parish have written letters on their behalf, and that we have contributed some of our parishioners' donations to help fund their defense. Now we can happily report that on Jan. 23rd, the day before the March for Life in Washington, President Trump granted pardons to 23 pro-life advocates in prison. Among those released: grandparents, mothers of young children, pastors, a Holocaust survivor (89 years old), and a Catholic priest, all prosecuted for non-violent protests at abortion clinics.

Yet not one of the 436 attacks on churches in 2023 were prosecuted under the FACE Act (and not for the attacks at St. Raymond in July 2022). But there is a light in the tunnel. Rep. Chip Roy (Texas) has introduced legislation to repeal the FACE Act, and this measure has been gaining support in the House and in the Senate led by Sen. Mike Lee (Utah). Pray for their success, and always remember your Bishop Sheen prayer to end abortion.

And so, Mr. Goodman, what was it like to be able to go to church again?

"Just being in church, entering into the liturgy, was like walking into the vestibule of Heaven".

Spring is Just Around the Corner!

Spring is quickly approaching! It's that time of year when we begin to plan our gardens. Our Garden Permit Program, available for most raised headstones, offers you the ability to grow a garden in front of your loved one's memorial, giving it a more personal touch. Plus, the year-long program gives you a cemetery-compliant border and flexibility to individualize your loved one's grave. We are happy to tell you that the permit fee will not increase this year and has not increased since the program was introduced in 2018! If you chose the Garden Permit Prime Program, the annual fee remains at \$50 and includes an upgraded landscape edging. The standard Garden Permit Program includes a black standard plastic landscape edging for a fee of \$35. Submit an application for either of these options. Please contact your cemetery by March 15th.

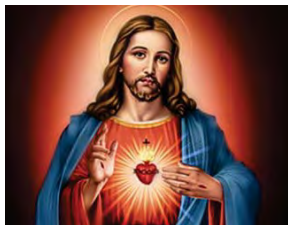
