Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION

- Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

Glory to Jesus Christ!

One of the hallmarks of the Lenten season is repentance.

This means both turning away from sin and turning toward God. This past Wednesday most of us heard this proclaimed “Repent and Believe in the Gospel!” as ashes were placed on our foreheads. How do we repent?

Repentance starts with the ability to look honestly at ourselves. Can we appraise where we are in relationship to our calling in Christ? The second step is to confess what we have done wrong or where we have fallen short: we need to be sorry and apologize. Then, we need to have a real willingness to change in concrete ways.

Does that process sound familiar? It should! It is the process for going to Confession! We examine our conscience, confess our sins, make an act of contrition, and seek to do penance and amend our life. As a matter of fact, those are all parts of the act of contrition that we say.

I encourage you to go to Confession at least once this Lent. In addition to the usual times, we will also have Confessions after Friday evening Stations of the Cross each week.

May God be with us and grant us a good Lent!

Another Pro-Life Issue

One Man's Perspective

A few weeks back, Father Cesar spoke at all the Masses and asked for prayers for members of our Hispanic community here in our parish. He told us that they



are scared and afraid that they will be rounded up by ICE and sent back to the countries that they came from. Many of them are here illegally, not having obtained the proper visa. I have prayed every day for them since then and will continue to do so.

I don't think there are many that I have spoken with who are against building a wall and halting what has really been an open door policy. The immigrants in our country did not create this situation, they simply took advantage of it and, yes, many are illegally here for doing so. But I differentiate between those who did simply that, and those who came here to take advantage of the situation and commit other, more serious crimes. No one wants people who have committed more serious crimes to stay here. They should serve their justly administered sentences in prison, and then be shipped right back to where they came from. There is very little argument here. We need to be protected. However, data does not support a rise in crime rates due to the presence of immigrants in our country. In fact, studies show the opposite is true and that they are less likely to commit crimes than our own citizens.

Numbers from Homeland Security show approximately 11 million illegal immigrants in this country. They are from one end of this country to the other and many have located here in Cape May, and many of them attend St. Raymond Church. For me, I find they are a welcome addition. They have been faithful and fervent parishioners, and our Church looks better than it has at any point in my 35 years in the parish. The Christmas display they erected is by far the best I have ever seen in a Church, and please come to St. Raymond at 5am on December 12th and see a packed Church as our parishioners honor Our Lady of Guadalupe. They love their Faith.

The Hispanic folks I have met all work, take good care of their homes (many fixer-ups are now gorgeous) and, frankly, when eligible they fight for this country. See the Hispanic Marine Corps casualties during the Iraq and Afghanistan conflict to validate this claim. They were in the thickest of fighting. They want to be Americans, and I say welcome aboard. If I lived where they came from, with violence and poverty, and I had the prospect of making a better life for my family, I would have done the same thing and come here.

They do need your help, but they need you to think about them most of all. How do you feel about this? Pretending the roundups by ICE are not happening is not the answer. We are a Faith of compassion and now would be a great time to put our Faith into Action. Prayers for them is all too important but so would a phone call or email to our congressmen or senators. Tell them you would like to see a path to legal status for these folks - a long one which would require they stay "model citizens" to become real ones in 5 or 7 years.



I have been told that the kids in our CCD classes who are old enough to understand are petrified they are going to leave the only home they have

ever known. Most of them only speak English. Someone other than me is going to have to tell them they do not belong here. I will not be the innkeeper at Bethlehem. When I taught at St. Raymond, in my classroom there was a sign on the wall which read WWJD, which stood for "What Would Jesus Do?" Ask yourself that question as you see what is happening to your neighbors. And as we sang this weekend in Church: "They will know we are Christians by our love."

LA CUARESMA (ACIPrensa)



La semana pasada el Bulletin dio un panorama de lo que es la Cuaresma y como vivir este tiempo de la Iglesia. Cada semana vamos a fijarnos en una de las **Características** de la Cuaresma. Esta semana es:

“Es un tiempo de 40 días”

En la Biblia, el número 40 tiene un significado simbólico que representa cambio, renovación, prueba, preparación y purificación. Los 40 días nos dan tiempo para mirarnos desde adentro y decidir si estamos contentos/as o no con lo que vemos y sentimos al mirarnos en el espejo. Cuando Jesús fue al desierto hizo justo eso. Pasó su tiempo en largas conversaciones con su Padre, y durante esa oración descubrió que tenía otra misión no solo de ser carpintero sino de ser el Mesías, el enviado de Padre, para llevar un mensaje a la humanidad “Dios Padre, mi padre y el tuyo/a te ama.” Viviendo es este amor nos salvamos. También, en la Biblia pasó varios acontecimientos de 40 días:

- ♦ Moisés pasó 40 días de oración en el monte Sinaí antes de recibir las Tablas de la Ley.
- ♦ El pueblo de Israel pasó 40 años en el desierto después de salir de Egipto.
- ♦ En el diluvio en tiempos de Noé.

Tras su crucifixión, el tiempo en el que se apareció a sus discípulos fue precisamente de 40 días (Hch 1,3). Entonces, En sí, el número 40, representa “cambio.” Es el tiempo de preparación de una persona o pueblo para dar un cambio fundamental. ¿Estás listo/a a dar un cambio fundamental de tu vida? Este es el tiempo de hacerlo.
