Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION

- Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

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Glory to Jesus Christ!

On Monday, March 17th, Bishop Sullivan will turn 80 years old. On this day, The Holy Father, Pope Francis, will accept his resignation as the 8th Bishop of Camden. Bishop Joseph Williams, our coadjutor bishop, will succeed him and become the 9th Bishop of Camden.

Bishop Sullivan was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of New York in 1971. He spent many years working with Spanish speaking immigrants in Manhattan and the Bronx. He was appointed vicar general of the Archdiocese of New York and ordained as an auxiliary bishop in 2004. He became Bishop of Camden on February 12, 2013.

I am grateful to Bishop Sullivan for supporting our parish these past 12 years. He has been with me almost my entire priestly ministry. He named me administrator and then pastor here. Bishop Sullivan also ordained Fr. Cesar to both the diaconate and the priesthood, assigned him to our parish, and created the Regional Hispanic Ministry for Cape May County at St. Raymond.

In his retirement Bishop Sullivan will remain in our Diocese. He hopes to continue to preside at Confirmations and be a part of other diocesan and parish activities.

I have had the opportunity to spend a little bit of time with Bishop Williams over the past few months. Just last weekend, he presided at the Confirmation in Hammonton where my godson was confirmed (I was his sponsor). This was the first time I heard our new Bishop interact with young people and their parents. I was particularly impressed with his emphasis on Evangelization and forming a deeper relationship with Christ. On April 3rd Bishop Williams will be at our parish for our Confirmation. I am looking forward to it!

Please keep both our bishops in your prayers this week: For Bishop Sullivan for a happy and blessed retirement, and Bishop Williams as he begins his new ministry as the 9th Bishop of Camden.

Bishop Sheen Prayer to End Abortion

“Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, I love you very much. I beg you to spare the life of the unborn baby that I have spiritually adopted who is in danger of abortion.” Who was Bishop Sheen? Well, if you remember him then you have cashed your share of Social Security checks! Bishop Sheen (1895-1979) hosted a TV program off and on from 1952-1968. From 1952-1955, he was on the Dumont TV network



(wow) and was their only Emmy Award winner, having over ten million viewers and facing Milton Berle on NBC. Berle, when Bishop Sheen won the Emmy said: “He’s got better writers—Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.”

In 1973 following the Roe decision to legalize abortion, Bishop Sheen wrote the Spiritual Adoption Prayer (above). And so, on March 25, the Feast of the Annunciation, we begin our nine month birth-journey with our spiritual baby, ending on Christmas Day when both our “baby” and the Christ baby are born. We ask you to take a card in the back of Church, adopt a spiritual baby, and pray this prayer everyday that somewhere, someone about to end that baby’s life through abortion, will change their mind. And then after this journey, perhaps donate a little something to Christ Child Society as an appropriate shower gift to honor your child. Since its beginning, millions of adoption cards have been handed out. Many of us have found comfort in giving our “baby” a name, perhaps a deceased Mom or Dad. We think of them every time we say our prayer.

Congressman Henry Hyde, a fervent pro-life advocate and a big fan of Bishop Sheen, spoke of the Final Judgement and how he believed that at that moment, “those in the pro-life movement will not be alone. I think there will be a chorus of voices that have never been heard in this world but are heard beautifully and clearly in the next world - and they will plead for everyone who has been in this movement. They will say to God, ‘Spare him, he loved us,’ and God will look at you and will not say, ‘Did you succeed?’ but ‘Did you try?’”

Join Lay Dominicans for Morning Prayer and rosary at 9am in the Adoration Chapel of St John of God campus on the 4th Sunday of each month.

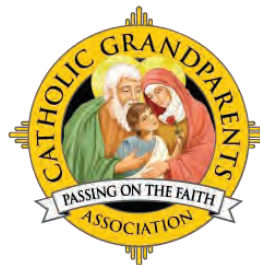


Our next meeting is March 23, 2025.

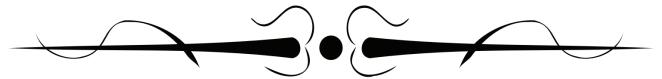
LENTEN SACRIFICES
