Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION

- Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

Glory to Jesus Christ!

This week we celebrate the great Solemnity of the Annunciation. This I often think of as the “forgotten” Feast Day of our Lord. Since it almost always occurs during Lent, we seem to miss out on the celebration. I’ve often wondered why it is not a Holy Day of Obligation (but I will have to take that up with the Bishops’ Conference).

On this day we commemorate when the archangel St. Gabriel appeared to the Virgin Mary to “announce” to her that God the Father has chosen her to be the Mother of God. He waits for her consent: “Be it done to me according to your word.” We know what happens next: “And the Word was made Flesh and dwelt among us!”

This week I invite you to reflect on where Christ continues to become incarnate in our world today. When have I been asked to say “yes” to God’s will in my life? Where have I said no?

When considering the Incarnation I also immediately think about the value and dignity of children in the womb. Though the law of the United States no longer allows abortion on demand, still many states, not to mention minds and hearts, are open to the practice of abortion. Where is God calling us to change opinions, as well as structures, to have us value all human life? What about the other places and ways that Life is trampled upon?

The Word was made flesh: May He continue to dwell in our hearts!

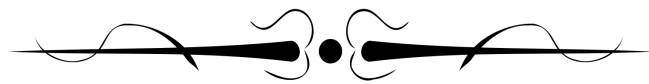

Pro Life Rosary

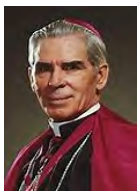

Bishop Sheen Prayer to End Abortion

“Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, I love you very much. I beg you to spare the life of the unborn baby that I have spiritually adopted who is in danger of abortion.” Who was Bishop Sheen? Well, if you remember him then you have cashed your share of Social Security checks! Bishop Sheen (1895-1979) hosted a TV program off and on from 1952-1968. From 1952-1955, he was on the Dumont TV network



(wow) and was their only Emmy Award winner, having over ten million viewers and facing Milton Berle on NBC. Berle, when Bishop Sheen won the Emmy said: “He’s got better writers—Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.”

In 1973 following the Roe decision to legalize abortion, Bishop Sheen wrote the Spiritual Adoption Prayer (above). And so, on March 25, the Feast of the Annunciation, we begin our nine month birth-journey with our spiritual baby, ending on Christmas Day when both our “baby” and the Christ baby are born. We ask you to take a card in the back of Church, adopt a spiritual baby, and pray this prayer everyday that somewhere, someone about to end that baby’s life through abortion, will change their mind. And then after this journey, perhaps donate a little something to Christ Child Society as an appropriate shower gift to honor your child. Since its beginning, millions of adoption cards have been handed out. Many of us have found comfort in giving our “baby” a name, perhaps a deceased Mom or Dad. We think of them every time we say our prayer.

Congressman Henry Hyde, a fervent pro-life advocate and a big fan of Bishop Sheen, spoke of the Final Judgement and how he believed that at that moment, “those in the pro-life movement will not be alone. I think there will be a chorus of voices that have never been heard in this world but are heard beautifully and clearly in the next world - and they will plead for everyone who has been in this movement. They will say to God, ‘Spare him, he loved us,’ and God will look at you and will not say, ‘Did you succeed?’ but ‘Did you try?’”

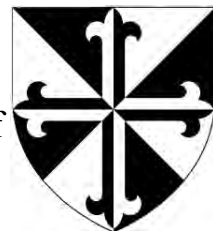

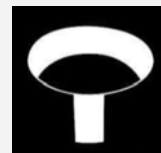

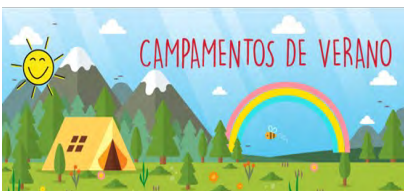
