Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION

- Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

Glory to Jesus Christ!

Next Sunday we will enter into
Passiontide or the “Passion

Season” of Lent. This last week of Lent and Holy Week mark the final preparations for celebrating the Paschal Mystery: the Suffering, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus.

The most notable feature of Passiontide would be that we cover the statues in church. Why? Part of the reason is to remember our Lord’s suffering, that he was “taken away” from us. But another reason (that I just learned!) is because of the traditional Gospel for this Sunday. In year “A” and every Mass where we have the blessing of those to be baptized at the Easter Vigil (the Scrutinies) we read John 9:1-41, the story of the man born blind. One verse before this, John 8:59 says, “So they picked up stones to throw at him, but Jesus hid himself and went out of the temple.”

What does “hiding Jesus” do for us? Well, sometimes things are more noticeable by their absence. Most of us are accustomed to looking at the Crucifix and other statues when we come into church. We don’t really see them anymore. But when we cover them, when they are “hidden,” we think about them more.

As we enter this last section of Lent, what do we need to take more notice of? Maybe it’s the progress of our Lenten penances (am I still doing everything I promised?). Or perhaps it is the reminder that each of us, along with the entire Church, needs to focus more on Jesus’ Passion.

LENTEN SACRIFICES

Pro Life Ministry

Where does all the food go?



Good question. The generosity of our parishioners never fails to amaze us. Back in November, the fronts of our churches

were packed with every conceivable variety of food. There were over 700 bags collected in total, and taken to Catholic Charities in Rio Grande and to Holy Redeemer in Seaville. The Knights of Columbus Council 3546 from our parish help run the food bank in Rio Grande by transporting the bags and volunteering to staff the pantry. It is our “Faith in Action” and what we, as followers of Christ, are called to do.

Catholic Charities provide a wide range of services, some of which depend on available funds. These are listed on their website and they are located in the strip mall at 1304 Rt.47S, and are open Monday thru Friday, 8:30am to 4pm. Food bags are available on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays with no questions asked, and only require a knock at the door. There is a small vestibule where a shelf is located with small amounts of cans, things you can grab in an emergency. Inside there are a series of rooms which have lots of shelves, all stacked with food. Sometimes there is a lot of food, and sometimes, like last summer, they begin to run out. Our Knights are there every week fixing bags and keeping the pantry running. And the staff there operate with compassion and love.

Does your food make a difference? I was there a few days ago and witnessed an elderly man come to the door for a bag. And one of those kind employees, Lauren Berntson,

answered the door. Almost like a Rockwell painting he stood there holding his hat in his hands and tried to explain:

Man: “I just need a little bit to hold us over. I have my grandbabies with us and we could really use this.”

Lauren: “You don’t have to explain. We don’t ask. In fact we still have a few turkeys left. Could you use one?”

Man: “Bless you! Wow! Bless you! As soon as the weather breaks I can get some work. I have nothing in the winter. Bless you!”



And off he went, a bag in one hand and a turkey in the other. And a couple days later a much younger man, when given a full bag of food, began to sort it and leave that which required cooking, as he said, “I have no place to cook my food.”

Many of us, most thankfully, have never been hungry to the point of starving, or even having to go to a local pantry to get a little extra. But as one who grew up thinking Spam was steak, I can attest that your food goes to a most worthy cause.

BEATO CARLO ACUTIS

¿Quién es Carlo Acutis qué hizo y por qué va a ser canonizado Santo por el Papa Francisco?

Carlo Acutis fue un joven italiano, aficionado a la informática y devoto, que murió a los 15 años de leucemia. Fue beatificado en 2020 y el Papa Francisco anunció que será proclamado santo en el Jubileo de los Adolescentes en 2025.

Aquí hay más detalles sobre Carlo Acutis:

- **Vida:** Nacido en Londres en 1991, Acutis se mudó a Milán con su familia cuando era niño.
- **Intereses:** Era un apasionado de la informática, la programación y la creación de sitios web, donde documentaba milagros eucarísticos y apariciones marianas.
- **Fe:** Tenía una profunda fe católica, con una gran devoción a la Eucaristía y a la Virgen María.
- **Muerte:** Murió de leucemia fulminante a los 15 años.
- **Beatificación:** Fue beatificado en 2020, tras la atribución de un milagro a su intercesión.
- **Canonización:** El Papa Francisco anunció que será canonizado en el Jubileo de los Adolescentes en 27 de abril, 2025.
- **Primer milagro:** Se le atribuye la curación de un niño brasileño con una enfermedad congénita en el páncreas.
- **Mensaje:** Acutis dejó un mensaje de vivir con Jesús, para Jesús y en Jesús.
- **Sitio web:** Creó un sitio web para documentar milagros eucarísticos y apariciones marianas.
- **Influencia:** Se le considera un "influencer" de Dios y un modelo para los jóvenes.
