Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION

- Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

From Father King

Glory to Jesus Christ!

Recently at a Scripture class
there was a question about go-
ing to Confession. I recom-

mend that most people go to Confession at
least 4 times per year. Others may go more
frequently. I don't let more than 2 weeks go
by without going to Confession!

In order to make a good Confession, we
ought to make a thorough examination of
conscience. What is an examination of con-
science? It is the act of going over our lives
to see where God has been present, where we
have sinned, and where we need to grow in
holiness and/or virtue. Here is a brief struc-
ture:

1. Pray to the Holy Spirit that He would en-
lighten you.
2. Recall and thank God for all the ways he
has been with you (Sacraments, graces,
special moments).
3. Review your life since your last examen
looking for the times when you sinned or
fell short of God's will.
4. Ask God for forgiveness and resolve to
not commit these sins again.
5. Look forward to the time ahead and ask
God where He wants you to grow.
6. Give thanks for making this examen.

Many saints and spiritual directors recom-
mend that we make an examen each day.
Then, when we prepare for Sacramental
Confession, we are accustomed to recalling
our shortcomings and sins and know what
we need to confess.

Remember, by Church precept, we must con-
fess all mortal sins at least once per year and
receive Holy Communion! We call this our
Easter Duty. It may be fulfilled from Ash
Wednesday through Trinity Sunday (so
now!). But I hope you would take advantage
of this much more frequently!

Pro Life Ministry

Where does all the food go?



Good question. The generosity of our parishioners never fails to amaze us. Back in November, the fronts of our churches

were packed with every conceivable variety of food. There were over 700 bags collected in total, and taken to Catholic Charities in Rio Grande and to Holy Redeemer in Seaville. The Knights of Columbus Council 3546 from our parish help run the food bank in Rio Grande by transporting the bags and volunteering to staff the pantry. It is our “Faith in Action” and what we, as followers of Christ, are called to do.

Catholic Charities provide a wide range of services, some of which depend on available funds. These are listed on their website and they are located in the strip mall at 1304 Rt.47S, and are open Monday thru Friday, 8:30am to 4pm. Food bags are available on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays with no questions asked, and only require a knock at the door. There is a small vestibule where a shelf is located with small amounts of cans, things you can grab in an emergency. Inside there are a series of rooms which have lots of shelves, all stacked with food. Sometimes there is a lot of food, and sometimes, like last summer, they begin to run out. Our Knights are there every week fixing bags and keeping the pantry running. And the staff there operate with compassion and love.

Does your food make a difference? I was there a few days ago and witnessed an elderly man come to the door for a bag. And one of those kind employees, Lauren Berntson,

answered the door. Almost like a Rockwell painting he stood there holding his hat in his hands and tried to explain:

Man: “I just need a little bit to hold us over. I have my grandbabies with us and we could really use this.”

Lauren: “You don’t have to explain. We don’t ask. In fact we still have a few turkeys left. Could you use one?”

Man: “Bless you! Wow! Bless you! As soon as the weather breaks I can get some work. I have nothing in the winter. Bless you!”



And off he went, a bag in one hand and a turkey in the other. And a couple days later a much younger man, when given a full bag of food, began to sort it and leave that which required cooking, as he said, “I have no place to cook my food.”

Many of us, most thankfully, have never been hungry to the point of starving, or even having to go to a local pantry to get a little extra. But as one who grew up thinking Spam was steak, I can attest that your food goes to a most worthy cause.

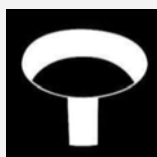
