Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION

- Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

From Father King

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Glory to Jesus Christ!

We have entered into the most
sacred time of the Christian

year: Holy Week. I invite you to take part in
as many of the liturgies and events as you
can this week.

Most of us are familiar with the Sacred Pas-
chal Triduum comprised of Holy Thursday,
Good Friday, and Easter Vigil. But there is
another liturgy of Holy Week that sometimes
gets forgotten: The Chrism Mass. Each year
in one Mass the bishop of each diocese gath-
ers with his clergy to celebrate a special
Mass commemorating when Jesus instituted
the priesthood at the Last Supper. At this
Mass all bishops and priests renew their
priestly promises to conform their lives to
Christ and to serve their people in prayer and
pastoral care. In addition, the bishop conse-
crates all of the Holy Oil that will be used in
the coming year. This includes the oil Fr.
Cesar and I use to anoint the sick and the
Sacred Chrism that is used at Confirmation
and Baptism. Though the Chrism is not itself
a sacrament, it is a sacred oil that has a
unique consecration. The bishop breathes in-
to it and he and all the priests pray over the
oil. I encourage you to experience this at
least once in your life!

You are invited to attend the Chrism Mass on
Tuesday, April 15th at 3:30pm at St. Agnes
Church of Our Lady of Hope Parish (701 Lit-
tle Gloucester Rd, Blackwood, NJ). I hope to
see you there.

A blessed Holy Week to you all!

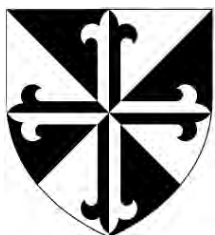

Mary, Pro Life, and the Rosary

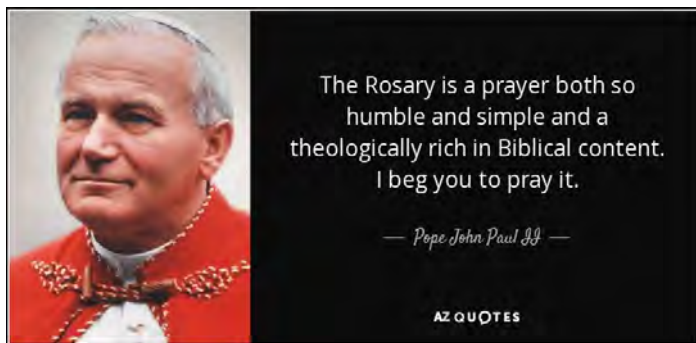
On Palm Sunday at all Masses we will be distributing “finger rosaries” to all in attendance. They are a perfect way to say your daily rosary, and frankly, they are beautiful at the same time. You have a choice of either the Divine Mercy or the Miraculous Medal rosary, all blessed and ready for you to pray with! And they fit perfectly on your key ring. Now really, what would you rather do, listen to what they now call “music” when driving your car, or say the rosary?

The rosary, as we now know it, is attributed to St. Dominic in a vision from the Blessed Mother in 1214. “Dear Dominic, do you know which weapon the Blessed Trinity wants to use to reform the world?” At the Feast of the Annunciation, we celebrate that Mary surrendered her will to that of God by saying, “Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word.”

Mary was Pro Life! She had free will just like us. And praying the rosary and asking Mary to take our prayers to her Son is a beautiful way to unite our own will to Christ’s will, to help us grow closer to Him, and to battle the evil of our day. And that fight against evil, as Paul said, “is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the world forces of this darkness, against the spiritual forces of wickedness in the heavenly places.” The rosary truly is a powerful weapon against evil.

And use your rosary to say the Divine Mercy Novena given to St. Faustina. It begins on Good Friday and runs nine days (ewtn.com). “On each day of the novena you will bring my heart to a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy...On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My passion, for the graces of these souls.”

So pick up a finger rosary and put it on your key ring. And let your kids see it so they know just where you stand on your Faith. And when they ask about it, get one for them too. All on us!

New Option: The Unannounced Mass Intention

Since our Mass Intention book is filling quickly, we have arranged for an alternative: *the Unannounced Mass Intention*. Many parishes employ this type of intention; it is not out of the ordinary, and it is something that should help us moving forward.

Mass Intentions The tradition of Masses offered for the intentions of living or deceased loved ones originated in the very early Church and continues to be an important Catholic practice. For us who believe that the Mass is the perfect prayer, no greater gift can be offered for our loved ones, living and deceased, who may still need the help of our prayers. Priests are under a strict obligation to remember in a special way the person for whom the Mass is being offered.

Masses are often requested for a loved one who has recently died or on the anniversary of a death. However, the gift of a Mass intention is also a wonderful way to offer prayers on the event of a wedding anniversary, a birthday, an anniversary of ordination or entrance into religious life. Masses may also be offered for the intentions of a person about to undergo surgery, who is recuperating from an illness, who wishes to overcome addiction, sin or has some other special need. Masses may be offered in thanksgiving for blessings, family, health and answer to prayers.

Depending on the wishes of one wanting to arrange for a Mass to be celebrated for a particular intention, there are two forms that a Mass intention may take:

Announced Mass intentions are offered on a particular day and time, are listed in the previous week's Sunday parish bulletin and,



at some point, before or during the Mass at which the intention will be offered. A card is provided indicating the date and time of the Mass.

Those arranging for an announced Mass intention are requested to make a stipend of \$15 to the parish for each intention.

Unannounced Mass intentions are offered without a specific day or time and may be celebrated by the priest on any day within one year. In case of need, unannounced Mass intentions may be passed on to neighboring parishes, retired priests or priests with a special ministry. Unannounced Mass intentions are not announced during the Mass at which they are offered or listed in the parish bulletin. A card is provided indicating that Mass will be celebrated, but no specific day or time will be included. Those arranging for an unannounced Mass intention are requested to make an offering of \$10 to the parish for each intention.

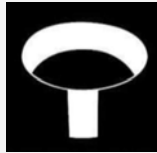
