

#### Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). **BAPTISM** - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

#### PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST

AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

**SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY** - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.



Christ is Risen!

(Fr. King is on retreat, so here is a column about **Blessed Carlo Acutis**, soon-to-be canonized. The infor-

mation was taken from an article appearing on the CNA website. By the time you read this, Father will have returned. (a)

Who was he? Carlo was born May 3, 1991 in London, but moved to Milan with his parents just a few months later. While a teenager, he was diagnosed with leukemia. Before his death in 2006, Carlo offered his sufferings for Pope Benedict XVI and for the Church, saying: "I offer all of my suffering to the Lord for the pope and for the Church in order not to go to purgatory but to go straight to heaven."

From a young age, Carlo had a special love for God, even though his parents weren't especially devout. Antonia Salzano, his mom, said that before Carlo, she went to Mass only for her first Communion, her confirmation, and her wedding. But as a young child, Carlo loved to pray the rosary. After he made his first Communion, he went to Mass as often as possible at the parish across from his elementary school. Carlo's love for the Eucharist also inspired a deep conversion for his mother. According to the postulator promoting his cause for sainthood, he "managed to drag his relatives, his parents to Mass every day. It was not the other way around; it was not his parents bringing the little boy to Mass, but it was he who managed to get himself to Mass and to convince others to receive Communion daily." His mother said: "He used to say, 'There are queues in front of a concert, in front of a football match, but I don't see these queues in front of the Blessed Sacrament' ... So, for him the Eucharist was the center of his life."

Carlo's witness of faith as a child led adults to convert and be baptized. Rajesh Mohur, who worked for the Acutis family as an au pair when Carlo was young, converted from Hinduism to Catholicism because of Carlo's witness. Carlo taught Mohur how to pray the rosary and told him about the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

Carlo was fascinated with computer coding and taught himself some of the basic coding languages. He used his computer skills and internet savvy to help his family put together an exhibition on Eucharistic miracles that has gone on to be displayed at thousands of parishes on five continents.

There is **so much more** to learn about Carlo! Just turn on your computer and give him a Google...

#### **Sorrow and Regret**

Numbers suggest that Catholic women are just as likely to have an abortion as any other group in our country. According to the Guttmacher Institute, 24% of women having abortions identified as Catholic, which closely mimics the 22% of women who overall identify as Catholic. Many of us come from a generation when abortion would have been unthinkable; but our children and grandchildren do not, and so many of our families are left with the scar that the loss of a child due to abortion brings. Make no mistake about abortion: "since the first century the Church has affirmed the moral evil of every procured abortion." (CCC 2271) And that evil extends to anyone who assists in an abortion: "Formal cooperation in an abortion constitutes a grave offense." (2272) But the awesome truth about our Faith is that there is always hope, always a way back to God. The confessional is always the first stop on our return to God.

"Come now, and let us set things right says the LORD, "Though your sins are as scarlet, They will be as white as snow; Though they are red like crimson, They will be like wool." (Is. 1:18)

But how many regret their participation in the abortion? Studies are inconsistent on this but according to LifeNews, "grief is much more common, and more intensely felt, than relief." According to their findings, relief was prominent only among the 30% of women who described their abortions as "wanted and consistent with my values and preferences." The study showed that 70% reported feeling pressured to abort by other



people or circumstances.

Sometimes, however, besides the confessional, we feel the need to talk to

someone who has "been there". This works for such groups as veterans, victims of crime, survivors of illnesses, and the list goes on. It just helps to talk with someone with a shared experience.

As Catholics we begin with prayer for those who suffer from the effects of participation in an abortion. And while doing so, we are always mindful to support, not judge. For as Jesus said to his disciples:

"Be **merciful**, just as your Father is **merciful**." (Luke 6:36)
