Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION

- Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

Christ is Risen!

In the past few weeks we have celebrated the Sacraments of Initiation with 30 members of our parish. At the Easter Vigils, two adults were Baptized, Confirmed, and received first Holy Communion. Additionally three adults were welcomed into the Catholic Church through a profession of faith, Confirmation, and Communion. Finally, this past weekend, 25 of our young people made their first Holy Communion. Congratulations to all!

The reception of the Most Blessed Sacrament, Holy Communion, is the pinnacle of the Sacraments of Initiation. The Eucharist, the Mass, is, as the Second Vatican Council teaches us, the source and summit of our faith. We are blessed to be a parish that prioritizes Eucharistic Adoration and devotion to the Most Blessed Sacrament.

I am happy to announce that this year we will celebrate 40 Hours Devotion June 20-22, during the Feast of Corpus Christi. Our guest preacher will be Fr. David Rivera. Fr. David is pastor of the Parish of St. Mary of Mt. Carmel in Hammonton, NJ. Fr. David is a graduate of St. Charles Borromeo Seminary, Philadelphia; the Catholic University of America, Washington, DC; the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas, Rome; and the Pontifical University of the Holy Cross, Rome. This year his parish is celebrating the 150th anniversary of their Mt. Carmel Celebration: the oldest/longest running Italian festival in the United States! Please join me in welcoming him for our annual celebration.

The schedule for 40 Hours will be published in the coming weeks. We do hope that you will join us both for times of Adoration and also for the Solemn Masses and Procession.

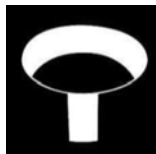

Por qué cambian de nombre los papas



Una de las incógnitas que arranca con el cónclave, es el nombre que adoptará el futuro Papa, una antiquísima tradición que suele servir como primera declaración de intenciones. ¿Será Francisco II? ¿Benedicto XVII? ¿Otro de los muchos Gregorio, Inocencio o León que se sucedieron a lo largo de la historia? Nadie lo sabe. Pero especular por eventuales nombres se convirtió en una práctica habitual en estos días romanos.

La tradición de que los papas cambien sus nombres al comienzo de sus 'reinados' surge en el comienzo del cristianismo. El propio Jesús de Nazaret rebautizó a Simón como Pedro, el fundador de su iglesia y, por lo tanto, primero entre los pontífices venideros. No obstante, el origen de esta costumbre es mucho menos bíblica y bastante posterior en el tiempo, ya que en los primeros siglos de la iglesia los obispos de Roma usaron generalmente sus propios nombres, acompañado a menudo con sus lugares de origen.

Esta costumbre cambió en el año 533, en las ruinas del Imperio Romano, cuando el elegido, Mercurio di Proietto, decidió llamarse Juan II para no llevar la denominación de un dios pagano. Con el paso del tiempo, esta práctica de la elección del nombre ha significado en muchas ocasiones toda una declaración de intenciones.

Bergoglio sorprendió al estrenar en 2013 el nombre de Francisco en honor al santo de Asís. Juan Pablo I (1978), fue el primero en unir dos nombres, recogiendo la herencia de sus dos influyentes predecesores, Juan XXIII (1958-1963) y Pablo VI (1963-1978), encargados de inaugurar y clausurar el revolucionario Concilio Vaticano II (1962-1965). Hasta la fecha, el nombre preferido por los pontífices de la historia ha sido Juan, el 'discípulo a quien Jesús amaba': se repite en 21 ocasiones. (ACI Prensa) ¡A estas alturas lo más probable es que ya tengamos un nuevo Papa!

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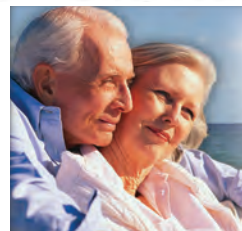
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
