

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. 



El Papa León XIV



El cardenal Robert Prevost, quien fue ungido como papa el jueves pasado, es el primer líder de la Iglesia católica nacido en Estados Unidos, pero su historia familiar es diversa y multicultural.

El obispo, que ejercerá su pontificado bajo el nombre de León XIV, nació en Chicago en 1955, hijo de una pareja de estadounidenses con raíces extranjeras.

El nuevo pontífice tiene dos hermanos mayores, Louis Martin y John Joseph.

Prevost mantiene una relación muy cercana con Perú, país cuya ciudadanía adoptó luego de vivir ahí durante tres décadas y donde hizo la mayor parte de su carrera pastoral.

En su primer discurso como papa, incluso dedicó unas palabras en español para el pueblo peruano: "Un saludo en particular a mi querida Diócesis de Chiclayo, en el Perú, donde un pueblo fiel ha acompañado a su obispo, ha compartido su fe y ha dado tanto, tanto, para seguir siendo la iglesia fiel de Jesucristo", dijo ya como León XIV.

Al referirse al origen familiar de León XIV, el diario The New York Times señaló en un artículo que "desciende de criollos de color de Nueva Orleans", según la documentación que genealogistas han recuperado sobre la familia materna del nuevo papa.

El nuevo papa es el menor de los tres hijos del matrimonio.

El mayor es Louis Martin, quien vive en Florida. Le sigue John Joseph, quien sigue viviendo en el área de Chicago.

Su vocación se veía desde niño, según Louis Martin: "Yo solía jugar con pistolas, cuchillos, arcos y flechas. Y él jugaba a ser sacerdote. Yo le decía '¡Qué aburrido! Vamos a jugar otra cosa, Rob".
