

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST

AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

From Father King +++

Glory to Jesus Christ!

In our second reading today, we hear St. Paul tell us, "Put to death, then, the parts of you that are earthly: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and the greed that is idolatry. Stop lying to one another..." This list is a very simple examination of conscience. Have I had evil desire? How often? Am I greedy? Do I lie? Do I treat my body as a temple of the Holy Spirit? Would I want someone else to treat me the way I treat myself?

It is good to regularly go to confession. Every 4-6 weeks is good. I consider 4 times a year a bare minimum. As Fr. Cesar is fond of saying: how long do you wait to take out the trash? I invite you to make a Summer confession if you have not done so already. And for those who do go to confession every month or so, I challenge you, when is the last time you used a different examination of conscience? Do you ever take one of Paul's letters and examine yourself in light of it? Have you looked up a new examine?

We don't confess our sins because we want to wallow in our wrongdoing. We confess because we want to grow and allow the Holy Spirit even greater access to our hearts. In the same way that we "take it easy" in the summer, not to be lazy but to renew, we change our habits not to dwell on our evil but to dwell on God's mercy and love!

May this summer continue to be an opportunity for rest, renewal, and growth.



Solanus Casey: Priest, Porter, Prophet



This extraordinary

film explores the heroic life of a remarkable, modern -day mystic, Father Solanus Casey, who was relegated to doing little more than being a simple doorman in his monastery. But God would transform the role his superiors assigned him, appointing it a far greater significance to be continued even beyond his earthly life: that of prophet, healer, and intercessor.



Known as a wonderworker and a powerful instrument of divine healing and hope, he touched countless lives. His untiring at-

tention to the sick and poor, combined with his prayers, wise counsel, and burning faith brought an unprecedented outpouring of grief at his death in 1957. More than twenty thousand people attended the funeral of this selfless American-born priest.

As a part of his canonization process, the exhumation of his body in 1987 revealed him to be "remarkably intact, and well preserved," seemingly defying corruption. One eyewitness was astonished to see a tiny glimpse of Fr. Solanus' piercing blue eyes again after being buried for thirty years!

A gripping story of this priest's simple and unshakable faith in God's love unfolds through interviews with his friends, colleagues, eyewitnesses, biographers, and direct recipients of his healing and prophecy. Rare, never-before-seen film footage and historical photographs are included with actual footage from the exhumation of this exemplary Servant of God.
