

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST

AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

From Father King +++

Glory to Jesus Christ!

Last week we prepared for the feast of the Holy Cross through Jesus' invita-

tion to take up our crosses, daily!, and follow after Him. What can it mean to take up our Crosses?

The first answer is obvious: what are those difficulties and sufferings that are in our lives that God is asking us to face? Is there something I'm avoiding: a pain, hurt, illness, resentment? How is Jesus revealing Himself to me through this?

Secondly, it is important to ask ourselves the question: What is God calling me toward? The answer for all of us is similar: He is calling us to be Great Saints! Not just to be holy but to be GREAT SAINTS! This is going to look different for each of our lives but each of us is called to Holiness

(Catechism of the Catholic Church, para 2013).

In order to reach this perfection the faithful should use the strength dealt out to them by Christ's gift, so that . . . doing the will of the Father in everything, they may wholeheartedly devote themselves to the glory of God and to the service of their neighbor. Thus the holiness of the People of God will grow in fruitful abundance, as is clearly shown in the history of the Church through the lives of so many saints. (Lumen Gentium 40 § 2)

Sometimes people will question me, "Father, what do I need to confess? I'm not aware of any sins!" I usually reply that we need to reflect on how we are responding to God's call in our life.

Is there a virtue that God is calling you to? A change you are called to make? A way that you are called to grow in Charity? If the answer is "no," then maybe we need to listen more attentively!

We Adore You Oh Christ and we bless You! Because by Your Holy Cross, You have redeemed the world!





He was a leader of youth in Italy in Catholic social justice and charitable organizations, and is the patron saint of World Youth Days. He died of the polio virus at the age of 24. 

On 13 September 335, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher (also called the Church of the Resurrection) was dedicated. The following day, the cross that Empress Helena had discovered on 14 September 320, was venerated in a solemn ceremony. In 614, the Persian King, Chosroes II, waged war on the Romans. After conquering Jerusalem, he confiscated many treasures, among which was the Cross of Jesus. The Byzantine emperor Heraclius initiated peace negotiations, but was rejected. He then waged war and won near Nineveh, asking for the restitution of the Cross, which then returned to Jerusalem. Today, the cruelty of the Cross is not what is exalted, but the Love that God manifested to humanity by accepting death on the Cross: "Who, though in the form of God, emptied himself, taking the form of a slave. This is the glory of the Cross of Jesus!" (Pope Francis) — Vatican News

La Muerte como Fin y Principio

Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica

II. MORIR EN CRISTO JESÚS

1008 La Muerte es consecuencia del pecado. Intérprete auténtico de las afirmaciones de la Sagrada Escritura y de la Tradición, el Magisterio de la Iglesia enseña que la Muerte entró en el mundo a causa del pecado del hombre. Aunque el hombre poseyera una naturaleza mortal, Dios lo destinaba a no morir. Por tanto, la Muerte fue contraria a los designios de Dios Creador, y entró en el mundo como consecuencia del pecado. "la Muerte temporal de la cual el hombre se habría liberado si no hubiera pecado", es así "el ultimo enemigo" del hombre que debe ser vencido.
