

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

Fr. Philemon Okoh, CM is the new chaplain to the Coast Guard Base in Cape May. As Lieutenant and Catholic Chaplain, he serves the spiritual and religious needs of all the recruits and others on base, Catholic or otherwise!

Fr. Phil is a member of the Congregation of the Mission, or Vincentians, the religious order of men founded by St. Vincent de Paul. Originally from Nigeria, he is one of 16 broth-



ers and sisters! A few of those siblings also live in the United States.





Don't you think it would be a great idea to purchase a paver to honor a special family member, a living relative, even a family name, maybe one in memory for someone special who has passed away.



While you may be considering cremation rather than traditional full-body burial, it's



The Church teaches that cremated remains must be reverently buried or entombed in a sacred place reserved for the burial of the dead. † Placement in an Existing Family Lot, Crypt or Niche

- Born John Cuidad, 8th March 1495 in Montemor O Novo, Portugal.
- Opened his hospital for poor, sick and dying in Granada, Spain 1537.
- Died in Granada 8th March 1550, aged 55 years.
- Declared a Saint by Pope Alexander VIII on 11th October 1690.
- Declared Patron of Sick and Dying by Pope Leo XIII, and declared Patron of Hospitals and all who work in them by Pope Pius XI.

Los Siete Sacramentos de la Iglesia

Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica

II. MORIR EN CRISTO JESÚS, RESUMEN

1210 Los sacramentos de la Nueva Ley fueron instituidos por Cristo y son siete, a saber, Bautismo, Confirmación, Eucaristía, Penitencia, Unción de los enfermos, Orden sacerdotal y Matrimonio. Los siete sacramentos corresponden a todas las etapas y todos los momentos importantes de la vida del cristianismo: dan nacimientos y crecimiento, curación y misión a la vida de fe de los cristianos. Hay aquí una cierta semejanza entre las etapas de la vida natural y las etapas de la vida espiritual.


