

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30PM - 3:30PM at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9:00AM Daily Mass at St. John of God; Every Thursday following 9:00AM Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9:00AM Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST

AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.




The Life and Message of Blessed John Henry Newman

BEREAVEMENT MINISTRY NEWS

A Special Indulgence for the Holy Souls

November is the time in the Liturgical year when the Church calls us to pray for the Holy souls in Purgatory.

From November 1st to the 8th, a plenary indulgence can be granted to the souls of our loved ones or to a soul with no one to pray for them. To gain this plenary indulgence, you must be detached from all sin, visit a cemetery and pray for the dead, make a sacramental confession (within 20 days), receive Holy Communion, and pray for the Pope's intentions (Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be) (cfr. Apostolic Constitution on Indulgences nos. 7&8).

The indulgence can be gained on each day from November 1st to the 8th as long as you complete the requirements. One sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate visit to a cemetery, Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Pope's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence.

During these days in November the members of the Bereavement Ministry plan to visit our local cemeteries to pray for the Holy Souls, and we invite you to do the same.

Reminders regarding Mass in Spanish

For the summer months, there was a 10am Sunday Mass at St. Raymond in Spanish. Now, for October and through the winter months, this Mass time will change to 12 noon (still in Spanish). Also, beginning October 29th, daily Mass in Spanish will now include Wednesdays. So, daily Mass in Spanish will occur each weeknight at 7pm at St. Raymond. We are blessed!

Bautismo, Confirmación, Eucarística, Penitencia, Unción de los enfermos, Orden Sacerdotal y Matrimonio

Capítulo Primero Los Sacramentos de la Iniciación Cristiana

1212 Mediante los sacramentos de la iniciación cristiana, el Bautismo, la confirmación y la Eucaristía, se ponen los *fundamentos* de toda vida cristiana. "La participación en la naturaleza divina, que los hombres reciben como don mediante la gracia de Cristo, tiene cierta analogía con el origen, el crecimiento y el sustento de la vida natural.
