

Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30pm-3:30pm at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9am daily Mass at St. John of God; every Thursday following 9am Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9am Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to or email one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS - If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

As I announced at some of the Masses last weekend, we are postponing our annual "Feed My Sheep" food drive. Historically, we donated the food collected to two Catholic agencies that served our community: Catholic Charities in Rio Grande and Holy Redeemer Food Pantry. Holy Redeemer has since moved farther north into the Marmora area. The Catholic Charities office in Rio Grande is in the process of shutting down to move to another area, yet to be determined.

Though there are many other good service agencies in our area, we are taking a few moments to reflect on how to best serve the needs in our own community. We are tentatively considering opening our own food cupboard here in the parish. This would be supervised by our own St. Vincent de Paul Society.

One area where we know there is need is in the Latino Community. The Parish and Regional Hispanic Ministry know of quite a few Spanish speaking families that are food-insecure and can use help, especially in the winter.

As your pastor, I thank you for your great generosity to both the parish and to those in need in our community. Hopefully we will have more information within a week or two to share with you.



BEREAVEMENT MINISTRY NEWS

A Special Indulgence for the Holy Souls

November is the time in the Liturgical year when the Church calls us to pray for the Holy souls in Purgatory.

From November 1st to the 8th, a plenary indulgence can be granted to the souls of our loved ones or to a soul with no one to pray for them. To gain this plenary indulgence, you must be detached from all sin, visit a cemetery and pray for the dead, make a sacramental confession (within 20 days), receive Holy Communion, and pray for the Pope's intentions (Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be) (cfr. Apostolic Constitution on Indulgences nos. 7&8).

The indulgence can be gained on each day from November 1st to the 8th as long as you complete the requirements. One sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate visit to a cemetery, Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Pope's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence.

During these days in November the members of the Bereavement Ministry plan to visit our local cemeteries to pray for the Holy Souls, and we invite you to do the same.

During the month of November, we also plan to honor our deceased parishioners, family members and friends with prayer. Praying for the dead is a rich Catholic tradition. Please, join us to pray the Rosary for the dead every Monday and Thursday in November.

Mondays we will pray the rosary at 2:10pm in the Chapel, immediately after the Blessed Sacrament is reposed.

Thursdays we will join with the Lay Dominicans to pray the Rosary for the dead at 5:30pm in the Chapel.

Come and join us in honoring and praying for the Holy Souls through the intercession of Our Blessed Mother.



Audio novel! An epic novel set in the rugged interior of British Columbia, the first volume of a trilogy which traces the lives of four generations of a family of exiles. Beginning in 1900, and concluding with the climactic events leading up to the Millennium, the series follows Anne and Stephen Delaney and their descendants as they live through the tumultuous events of this century.

Anne is a highly educated Englishwoman who arrives in British Columbia at the end of the First World War. Raised in a family of spiritualists and Fabian socialists, she has fled civilization in search of adventure. She meets and eventually marries a trapper-homesteader, an Irish immigrant who is fleeing the "troubles" in his own violent past. This is a story about the gradual movement of souls from despair and unbelief to faith, hope, and love, about the psychology of perception, and about the ultimate questions of life, death, and the mystery of being. Interwoven with scenes from Ireland, England, Poland, Russia, and Belgium during the War, Strangers and Sojourners is a tale of the extraordinary hidden within the ordinary. It is about courage, fear, and the triumph of the human spirit.

Artículo 1 EL SACRAMENTO DEL BAUTISMO

II EL BAUTISMO EN LA ECONOMIA DE LA SALVACIÓN

Las Prefiguraciones del Bautismo en la Antigua Alianza

1220 Si el agua de manantial simboliza la vida, el agua del mar es un símbolo de la muerte. Por lo cual, pudo ser símbolo del misterio de la Cruz. Por este simbolismo el bautismo significa la comunión con la muerte de Cristo.

1221 Sobre todo el paso del mar Rojo, verdadera liberación de Israel de la esclavitud de Egipto, es el que anuncia la liberación obrada por el bautismo:

¡Oh Dios!, que hiciste pasar a pie enjunto por el mar Rojo a los hijos de Abraham, para que el pueblo liberado de la esclavitud del faraón fuera imagen de la familia de los bautizados.


