## Sacraments

**RECONCILIATION** - Every Saturday, 2:30pm-3:30pm at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9am daily Mass at St. John of God; every Thursday following 9am Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9am Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

**BAPTISM** - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

**SACRAMENT OF THE SICK** - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

### PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF

**EUCARIST AND CONFIRMATION** - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

**SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY** - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to or email one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

**SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS** - If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: [camdenpriest.org](http://camdenpriest.org).



## BEREAVEMENT MINISTRY NEWS

### A Special Indulgence for the Holy Souls

November is the time in the Liturgical year when the Church calls us to pray for the Holy souls in Purgatory.

From November 1st to the 8th, a plenary indulgence can be granted to the souls of our loved ones or to a soul with no one to pray for them. To gain this plenary indulgence, you must be detached from all sin, visit a cemetery and pray for the dead, make a sacramental confession (within 20 days), receive Holy Communion, and pray for the Pope's intentions (Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be) (cfr. Apostolic Constitution on Indulgences nos. 7&8).

The indulgence can be gained on each day from November 1st to the 8th as long as you complete the requirements. One sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate visit to a cemetery, Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Pope's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence.

During these days in November the members of the Bereavement Ministry plan to visit our local cemeteries to pray for the Holy Souls, and we invite you to do the same.

During the month of November, we also plan to honor our deceased parishioners, family members and friends with prayer. Praying for the dead is a rich Catholic tradition. Please, join us to pray the Rosary for the dead every Monday and Thursday in November.

**Mondays** we will pray the rosary at 2:10pm in the Chapel, immediately after the Blessed Sacrament is reposed.


**Thursdays** we will join with the Lay Dominicans to pray the Rosary for the dead at 5:30pm in the Chapel.





1224 Nuestro Señor se sometió voluntariamente al bautismo de San Juan, destinado a los pecadores, para "cumplir toda justicia". Este gesto de Jesús es una manifestación de su "anonadamiento". El Espíritu que se cernía sobre las aguas de la primera creación desciende entonces sobre Cristo, como preludio de la nueva creación, y el Padre manifiesta a Jesús como su "Hijo amado"

1225 En su Pascua, Cristo abrió a todos los hombres las fuentes del Bautismo. En efecto, había hablado ya de su pasión que iba a sufrir en Jerusalén como de un "Bautismo" con que debía ser bautizado. La sangre y el agua que brotaron del costado traspasado de Jesús crucificado son figuras del Bautismo y de la Eucaristía, sacramentos de la vida nueva: desde entonces, es posible "nacer del agua y del Espíritu" para entrar en el Reino de Dios.

Considera dónde eres bautizado, de dónde viene el Bautismo: de la cruz de Cristo, de la muerte de Cristo. Ahí está todo el misterio: El padeció por tí. En él eres rescatado, en él eres salvado.




