Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30pm-3:30pm at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9am daily Mass at St. John of God; every Thursday following 9am Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9am Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to or email one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS - If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

Glory to Jesus Christ our King!

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Jesus Christ the King and proclaim Him to be our Lord and Ruler. This is the last Sunday of the liturgical year and thus serves as a capstone for us all. After celebrating His coming into the world (Christmas), His Paschal Mystery (Easter), His institution of the Church (Pentecost), and following Him as His disciples (Ordinary Time), we again affirm Him as the center of our world and our lives.

That means that next Sunday we begin a new liturgical year! This coming year we will be in Liturgical “Year A” and “Cycle II.” In the Liturgical Calendar we primarily read from a different Gospel each Sunday. In “Year A” we will hear mostly from St. Matthew’s Gospel. This past year (“Year C”) we read from St. Luke. Matthew’s Gospel presents us with the most “Jewish” perspective with a strong emphasis on the Old Testament, and is the most structured and organized. This would all be indicative that the Gospel takes its origin from a Jewish tax-collector/scribe. Jesus is presented as a new law-giver, a new Moses who frees His people from their life of sin and brings them to the promised land of Heaven.

As we prepare for Advent and the new liturgical year, maybe we can resolve to spend more time each day with Sacred Scripture and open our hearts anew to where God is calling us!



BEREAVEMENT MINISTRY NEWS

A Special Indulgence for the Holy Souls

November is the time in the Liturgical year when the Church calls us to pray for the Holy souls in Purgatory.

From November 1st to the 8th, a plenary indulgence can be granted to the souls of our loved ones or to a soul with no one to pray for them. To gain this plenary indulgence, you must be detached from all sin, visit a cemetery and pray for the dead, make a sacramental confession (within 20 days), receive Holy Communion, and pray for the Pope's intentions (Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be) (cfr. Apostolic Constitution on Indulgences nos. 7&8).

The indulgence can be gained on each day from November 1st to the 8th as long as you complete the requirements. One sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate visit to a cemetery, Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Pope's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence.

During these days in November the members of the Bereavement Ministry plan to visit our local cemeteries to pray for the Holy Souls, and we invite you to do the same.

During the month of November, we also plan to honor our deceased parishioners, family members and friends with prayer. Praying for the dead is a rich Catholic tradition. Please, join us to pray the Rosary for the dead every Monday and Thursday in November.

Mondays we will pray the rosary at 2:10pm in the Chapel, immediately after the Blessed Sacrament is reposed.

Thursdays we will join with the Lay Dominicans to pray the Rosary for the dead at 5:30pm in the Chapel.

Come and join us in honoring and praying for the Holy Souls through the intercession of Our Blessed Mother.

Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe



In its core document, Our First, Most Cherished Liberty: A Statement on Religious Liberty, the USCCB Ad Hoc Committee for Religious Liberty "urge[d] that the Solemnity of Christ the King—a feast born out of resistance to totalitarian incursions against religious liberty—be a day specifically employed by bishops and priests to preach about religious liberty, both here and abroad."

Let us pray fervently that we will help others encounter anew Christ, our King, bringing the Gospel to the margins of society, that all might bear witness to Him before others.


On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King. Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical Quas primas ("In the first") to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever. —USCCB.org

HOW TO ADVENT

Advent sometimes just feels like that time that is sandwiched between Thanksgiving and Christmas – life is hectic with Christmas shopping, parties, the school year ending, and so much more. But as Catholics – we really ought to enter into this season of joyful anticipation with purpose and intention! In How to Advent, we will discover the rich traditions that mark this season and how they aid us in preparing our hearts for the birth of the child Jesus at Christmas. Guided by priests, religious, professors, and a charismatic host, you will gain practical tips and spiritual reflection on the practices of the Advent calendar, Advent wreath, Jesse tree, and nativity scene.

There are four episodes in this show that are between 12 and 15 minutes.

Capítulo Primero

Los Sacramentos de la Iniciación Cristiana

Artículo 1 EL SACRAMENTO DEL BAUTISMO

II EL BAUTISMO EN LA ECONOMIA DE LA SALVACIÓN

El Bautismo en la Iglesia

1226 Desde el día de Pentecostés la Iglesia ha celebrado y administrado el santo Bautismo. En efecto, San Pedro declara a la multitud conmovida por su predicación: “Convertíos y que cada uno de vosotros se haga bautizar en el nombre de Jesucristo, para remisión de vuestros pecados; y recibireis el don del Espíritu Santo” (Hch 2, 38). Los apóstoles y sus colaboradores ofrecen el bautismo a quien crea en Jesús: Judíos, hombres temerosos de Dios, paganos. El Bautismo aparece siempre ligado a la fe: “Ten fe en el Señor Jesús y te salvarás tú y tu casa”, declara San Pablo a su carcelero en Filipos. El relato continúa: “el carcelero inmediatamente recibió el bautismo, él y todos los suyos” (Hch 16, 31-33).

1227 Segun el Apóstol San Pablo por el Bautismo el creyente participa en la muerte de Cristo; es sepultado y resucita con Él:

¿O es que ignoráis que cuantos fuimos bautizados en Cristo Jesús, fuimos bautizados en su muerte?. Fuimos, pues, con el sepultados por el Bautismo en la muerte, a fin de que, al igual que Cristo fue resucitado de entre los muertos por medio de la gloria del Padre, así también nosotros vivamos una vida nueva (Rm 6, 3-4).

Los Bautizados se han “revestido de Cristo” (Ga3, 27). Por el Espíritu Santo, el Bautismo es un baño que purifica, santifica y justifica.

1228 El Bautismo es, pues, un baño de agua en el que la “semilla incorruptible” de la Palabra de Dios produce su efecto vivificador. San Agustín dirá del Bautismo: “Accedit verbum ad elementum, et fit sacramentum” (“Se une la palabra a la materia, y se hace el sacramento”).


