Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30pm-3:30pm at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9am daily Mass at St. John of God; every Thursday following 9am Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9am Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to or email one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS - If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.



Christ is Born for us! Come let us Adore Him!

Today we liturgically celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany. On this day, Christ is “manifest to the nations” when the Magi came to visit Him. Christ continues to make Himself known in the Sacred Liturgy, in His Word, and through our proclamation of His Good News.

Tomorrow we celebrate the Feast of our parish Patron, St. John Neumann. St. John was a great missionary of the 19th century. He was not the sort of missionary who was bringing the Gospel to those who had never heard it before, rather, it was bringing the Good News to those who needed strength in their faith. For him, it was the immigrants of the early 19th century who were living as farmers and workers in poverty, far away from their homelands.

Like St. John Neumann, we are called to be missionaries to those who need strength in their faith. Yes, the immigrants and the impoverished, but also those who are weary from the many demands and anxieties of the world. Though we might not need to leave our homes as St. John did, we will need to step out of our comfort zones to give witness to Christ.



May St. John Neumann inspire us by his life and preaching, and may he intercede for us from his blessed abode with all the elect in Heaven!





IT IS STILL CHRISTMAS!

Christmas is one of the most important days of the Church year, second only to Easter itself. Celebrating the birth of the Lord Jesus Christ, it is the culmination of the mystery of the incarnation, the feast of God becoming flesh (the Latin "in carne" means "enfleshment"). It is a uniquely Christian teaching, the Divine choosing to become one of us. Because of this belief, God is not only Transcendent, but also wholly Immanent, Emmanuel (God-with-us). While remaining Transcendent (meaning we must rise above our present condition to reach Him), He is at the same time Immanent (meaning He is with us as we rise toward Him). Every Eucharist is like Christmas where the bread and wine are transformed into His flesh, His Body and Blood, and, in a sense, He is born anew on the altar.

The liturgical season of Christmas begins with the vigil Masses on Christmas Eve and concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. During this season, we celebrate the birth of Christ into our world and into our hearts and reflect on the gift of salvation that is born with him, including the fact that he was born to die for us.

The Christmas tree and the Nativity scene are popular symbols of the season and a tradition in many Christian homes. It is also traditional to exchange Christmas gifts with family and friends to honor God the Father's gift of his only son to the world. Having received the gift of Christ, we naturally want to pass that gift along to our loved ones.



El Bautismo de adultos

1247 En los orígenes de la Iglesia, cuando el anuncio del Evangelio está aún en sus primeros tiempos, el Bautismo de adultos es la práctica más común. El catecumenado (preparación para el Bautismo) ocupa entonces un lugar importante. Iniciación a la fe y a la vida cristiana, el catecumenado debe disponer a recibir el don de Dios en el Bautismo, la Confirmación y la Eucaristía.

1248 El catecumenado, o formación de los catecúmenos, tiene por finalidad permitir a estos últimos, en respuesta a la iniciativa divina y en unión con una comunidad eclesial, llevar a madurez su conversión y su fe. Se trata de una "formación, aprendizaje o noviciado debidamente prolongado de la vida cristiana, en que los discípulos se unen con Cristo, su Maestro. Por lo tanto, hay que iniciar adecuadamente a los catecúmenos en el misterio de la salvación, en la práctica de las costumbres evangélicas y en los ritos sagrados que deben celebrarse en los tiempos sucesivos, e introducirlos en la vida de fe, la liturgia y la caridad del Pueblo de Dios" (AG 14; cf. Ritual de iniciación cristiana de adultos, Prenotandos 19; Ibíd., Sobre el tiempo del catecumenado y de sus ritos 98).

1249 Los catecúmenos "están ya unidos a la Iglesia, pertenecen ya a la casa de Cristo y muchas veces llevan ya una vida de fe, esperanza y caridad" (AG 14). "La madre Iglesia los abraza ya con amor tomándolos a sus cargo" (LG 14; cf CIC can. 206; 788).




