Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30pm-3:30pm at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9am daily Mass at St. John of God; every Thursday following 9am Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9am Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to or email one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS - If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

Christ is Born for us! Glorify Him!

On the Baptism of the Lord we look to our own baptism. Yes, most of us were too young to remember it, but it is the most important thing that ever happened to us. When Christ went into the waters of the Jordan he transformed water itself, and made it capable of taking away our sinful nature. Today as we hear that He was baptized by John and affirmed by God the Father, we remember that we were baptized in the Holy Trinity and made beloved children of God. “You are my beloved son, you are my beloved daughter” - these are God’s words to us.





How long has it been since you've read something by Jane Austen? High school? Perhaps college? There are two of her books presented on Formed via audio that would be a lot of fun to listen to while you're exercising, walking, or stuck inside on a rainy afternoon. One is **Sense and Sensibility** and the other is **Pride and Prejudice**. Both are excellent and have been put to film many times, but listening to them is an entirely different matter. If you've never listened to an audio book before, this is a great place to start!

From Formed: Jane Austen is arguably the finest female novelist who ever lived, and **Pride and Prejudice** is perhaps the finest, at least certainly the most popular, of her novels. An undoubted classic of world literature, its profound Christian morality is all too often missed or willfully overlooked by today's (post) modern critics. Yet Austen saw the follies and foibles of human nature, and the frictions and fidelities of family life, with an incisive eye that penetrates to the very heart of the human condition. This edition of Austen's masterpiece includes an introduction by Professor Christopher Blum and several insightful critical essays by leading Austen scholars.

MARCH FOR LIFE

23rd January 2026

Over the past 50+ years, the National March for Life has collectively united millions of pro-life Americans from every age, background, nationality, and faith with a common purpose: to joyfully witness to the inherent dignity and worth of every single human life, especially those endangered by abortion. The March's powerful presence in the nation's capital every January has demonstrated the seriousness, conviction, and permanence of the movement. It has also helped educate Americans about the beauty of the lives of unborn children and their mothers so that a majority of Americans now support protections for life in the womb at least by the time a baby can feel the pain of an abortion.

In the two years since the Dobbs decision overturning Roe v. Wade returned the freedom to enact pro-life laws, the pro-life community has: fought the advancement of relentless and radical pro-abortion legislation at both the state and federal level; faced attempts to destroy and discredit pro-life pregnancy resource centers; and even battled deadly misinformation campaigns related to state pro-life protections – every one of which allows for medical treatment to save the life of the mom. The goal of the National March for Life is to not only change laws at the state and federal level, but to change the culture to ultimately make abortion unthinkable.

This year's theme: ***Life is a Gift!***

The Pre-March Rally features inspiring speeches from pro-life leaders to encourage us to draw renewed energy for this challenging moment in the movement by reflecting on the basic truth that inspires the pro-life cause: every human life – including the unborn and their mothers – is beautiful, has unique dignity, and is worthy of protection; more information can be found at: www.MarchForLife.org

For those unable or not wishing to march, the buses will park for the day at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, where they can disembark to pray, attend Holy Mass at 12:10pm, participate in Eucharistic adoration or take a tour.

The Knights of Columbus Fr. Francis P. Araneo Chapter is again sponsoring a trip to the March this year; there is no charge for transportation, but riders will be responsible for their own meals/drinks, and we ask a contribution of at least \$5.00 per rider toward a tip for the driver.

III LA CELEBRACIÓN DEL SACRAMENTO DEL BAUTISMO

El Bautismo de niños

1250 Puesto que nacen con una naturaleza humana caída y manchada por el pecado original, los niños necesitan también el nuevo nacimiento en el Bautismo (cf DS 1514) para ser librados del poder de las tinieblas y ser trasladados al dominio de la libertad de los hijos de Dios (cf Col 1,12-14), a la que todos los hombres están llamados. La pura gratuitad de la gracia de la salvación se manifiesta particularmente en el bautismo de niños. Por tanto, la Iglesia y los padres privarían al niño de la gracia inestimable de ser hijo de Dios si no le administraran el Bautismo poco después de su nacimiento (cf CIC can. 867; CCEO, can. 681; 686,1).

1251 Los padres cristianos deben reconocer que esta práctica corresponde también a su misión de alimentar la vida que Dios les ha confiado (cf LG 11; 41; GS 48; CIC can. 868).

1252 La práctica de bautizar a los niños pequeños es una tradición inmemorial de la Iglesia. Está atestiguada explícitamente desde el siglo II. Sin embargo, es muy posible que, desde el comienzo de la predicación apostólica, cuando "casas" enteras recibieron el Bautismo (cf Hch 16,15.33; 18,8; 1 Co 1,16), se haya bautizado también a los niños (cf. Congregación para la Doctrina de la Fe, Instr. *Pastoralis actio* 4: AAS 72 [1980] 1139).


