BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to
call or make an appointment at the office for
baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is
celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday
Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate
from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously
ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due
to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest
for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call
the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of
Holy Communion are available to bring Communion
to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in
the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to
continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF

EUCCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll
your child in our Religious Education Program.
Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that
the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades
and after a minimum of 2 years of religious
formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more
information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or
groom may contact the parish office requesting to be
married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12
months. Please speak to or email one of the priests to
confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS - If a man from our
parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or
diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr.

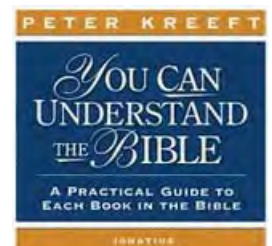

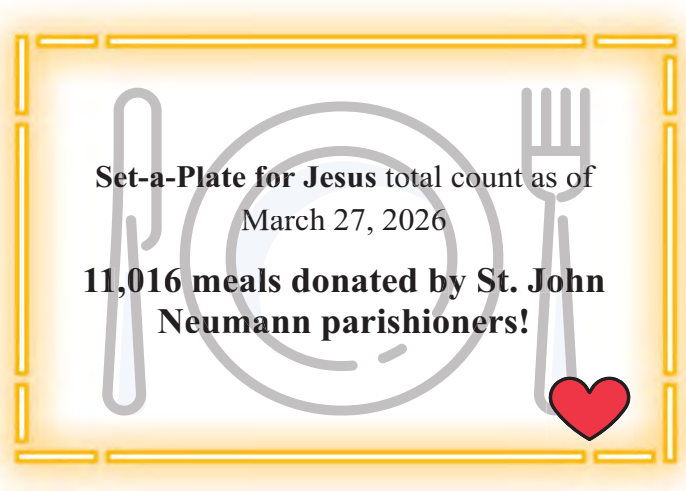

Raymond opened and have remained here in various capacities since the school closed in 2008. We will not only see the loss of the I.H.M. presence but also our personal loss of some incredible people: Sister Kathleen, Sister JoAnna, Sister Marie, and Sister Anne. It will be a difficult loss, but St. John Neumann is a vibrant parish and together we will survive this. In the meantime, it is the intention of Father King and this parish to not only celebrate 64 years of I.H.M. contributions, but also say goodbye to those Sisters still here. St. Raymond Catholic Church and School

Our Faith Journey

As we celebrate the legacy of the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary here at St. Raymond, we would like to begin by taking a quick look at the history of our church.

In 1932, Catholics living in the Villas area petitioned Rev. John R. O'Connor, Pastor of Our Lady Star of the Sea Church in Cape May, to celebrate Mass each Sunday in the Villas. With permission from the Diocese, the first Mass was celebrated on July 24, 1932, in the old firehouse on Bayshore Road between Delaware and Atlantic Ave.

The fire engines were parked outside during Mass and attendance at the first Mass was reported to be 200 adults and 75 children. It was not long before this arrangement was deemed too small. The decision was made to build a church in the Villas area. However, St. Raymond remained a mission of Our Lady Star of the Sea Parish in Cape May until 1954.

In November 1936, a contract was signed to purchase two lots on Block 54 on Hudson Ave., Villas for \$500 each. The church was completed at the cost of \$8000 and was blessed on May 29, 1937 by Right Reverend Maurice R. Spillane, Vicar General of the Diocese of Trenton. Present also were Father O'Connor as well as Father Paul N. Fairbrother, who would serve as Pastor of Star of the Sea and its mission, St. Raymond Church until 1944. In December 1937, a decree from Rome created the Camden Diocese.

In 1944, Father Manion was appointed to Star of the Sea and St. Raymond Mission. In 1947 under Father Manion, the church was elevated 12 feet to create a parish hall beneath it. Father Manion continued to serve until 1954, when Bishop Eustace declared St. Raymond's to be a parish and named Father William A. Regan as the first pastor. Father Regan began construction of the Parish Hall in 1957 to alleviate crowding at the Masses, and as a youth center, and to accommodate all social functions. The building cost \$100,000 and was paid off in seven years. It was dedicated in January 1959.

At the same time, an increasing number of children from St. Raymond were attending the parish schools in Cape May, Wildwood, and Stone Harbor. As they became overcrowded, the pastors of the schools asked Father Regan to help alleviate this problem. A school had to be built at St. Raymond Parish.

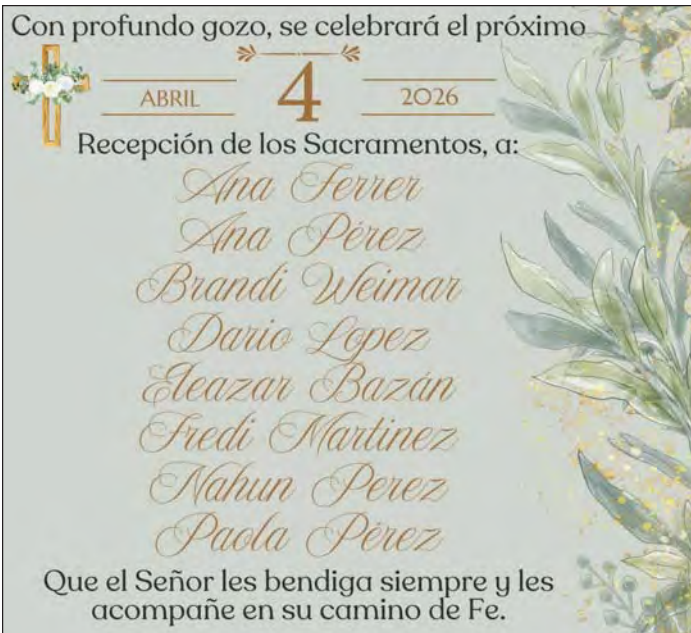

Capítulo Primero

Los Sacramentos de la Iniciación Cristiana

Artículo 1 EL SACRAMENTO DEL BAUTISMO

VII LA GRACIA DEL BAUTISMO

Resumen

1275 La iniciación cristiana se realiza mediante el conjunto de tres sacramentos: el Bautismo, que es el comienzo de la vida nueva; la Confirmación, que es su afianzamiento; y la Eucaristía, que alimenta al discípulo con el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo para ser transformado en Él.

1276 "Id, pues, y haced discípulos a todas las gentes, bautizándolas en el nombre del Padre y del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo, enseñándoles a guardar todo lo que yo os he mandado" (Mt 28,19-20).

1277 El Bautismo constituye el nacimiento a la vida nueva en Cristo. Según la voluntad del Señor, es necesario para la salvación, como lo es la Iglesia misma, a la que introduce el Bautismo.

1278 El rito esencial del Bautismo consiste en sumergir en el agua al candidato o derramar agua sobre su cabeza, pronunciando la invocación de la Santísima Trinidad, es decir, del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo.

1279 El fruto del Bautismo, o gracia bautismal, es una realidad rica que comprende: el perdón del pecado original y de todos los pecados personales; el nacimiento a la vida nueva, por la cual el hombre es hecho hijo adoptivo del Padre, miembro de Cristo, templo del Espíritu Santo. Por la acción misma del bautismo, el bautizado es incorporado a la Iglesia, Cuerpo de Cristo, y hecho partícipe del sacerdocio de Cristo.

1280 El Bautismo imprime en el alma un signo espiritual indeleble, el carácter, que consagra al bautizado al culto de la religión cristiana. Por razón del carácter, el Bautismo no puede ser reiterado (cf DS 1609 y 1624).

1281 Los que padecen la muerte a causa de la fe, los catecúmenos y todos los hombres que, bajo el impulso de la gracia, sin conocer la Iglesia, buscan sinceramente a Dios y se esfuerzan por cumplir su voluntad, pueden salvarse aunque no hayan recibido el Bautismo (cf LG 16).

1282 Desde los tiempos más antiguos, el Bautismo es dado a los niños, porque es una gracia y un don de Dios que no suponen méritos humanos; los niños son bautizados en la fe de la Iglesia. La entrada en la vida cristiana da acceso a la verdadera libertad.

1283 En cuanto a los niños muertos sin bautismo, la liturgia de la Iglesia nos invita a tener confianza en la misericordia divina y a orar por su salvación.

1284 En caso de necesidad, toda persona puede bautizar, con tal que tenga la intención de hacer lo que hace la Iglesia, y que derrame agua sobre la cabeza del candidato diciendo: "Yo te bautizo en el nombre del Padre y del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo".
