Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30pm-3:30pm at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9am daily Mass at St. John of God; every Thursday following 9am Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9am Mass; also Monday and Thursday evenings after Mass (Spanish). Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF

EUCCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call Sr. Kathleen for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to or email one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS - If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. King or Fr. Cesar to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

This past Wednesday we celebrated the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima. Our Lady asked for the following: that we repent, turning our hearts toward Jesus; that we do penance and offer up sacrifices for the conversion of sinners; that we remember that atheism and sin destroy our souls and society; that we have devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and pray the rosary; and that we hold firm, with confident Hope, that She will triumph with Her Son.

On the Ascension, the Apostles saw Jesus taken up to heaven. He would walk with them no longer. Though filled with expectation, they were also fearful as they prayed for the Holy Spirit. When life seems uncertain or we are filled with worry and anxiety, we often either try to control situations or become depressed and despairing. But there IS something we can do: turn towards Our Lady. We can offer up our difficulties and pains, our worries and distractions. If our Blessed Mother could watch Her Son go to the cross and remain in Hope, we can face any of life's difficulties.

During this month of May, dedicated to our Lady, we remain firm in our conviction that Jesus will triumph - He will make all things well for those who believe and work with Him. And we remember Our Lady's words: "In the end, my Immaculate Heart will triumph."

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!! Alleluia!!!

In a world torn apart by persecution, war, and oppression, three children in Fatima, Portugal, were chosen



by God to offer an urgent message of hope to the world. Based on the memoirs of the oldest seer, Lucia Santos, and many thousands of independent eyewitness accounts, *The 13th Day* dramatizes the true story of three young shepherds who experienced six apparitions of Our Lady between May and October 1917, which culminated in the final prophesied Miracle of the Sun on October 13. Abducted from their homes, thrown into prison, and interrogated under the threat of death in the government's attempt to silence them, the children remained true to their story about the crucial messages from Mary of prayer, repentance, and conversion for the world.

Our Lady gave a secret to the children told in three parts, from a harrowing vision of hell, to prophetic warnings of future events including the advent and timing of the Second World War, the spread of Communism, and the attempted assassination of the Pope.

This movie is not rated, but was created with an adult audience in mind. It may contain violence indicative of the life and times of the saint or character portrayed. We would recommend Parental Guidance and that parents preview it before watching with children.

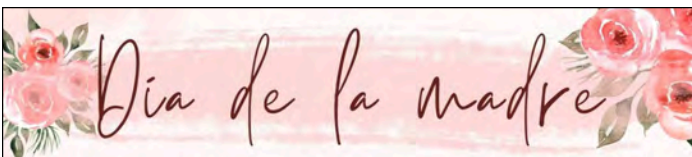

Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica

Los Siete Sacramentos de la Iglesia

Bautismo, Confirmación, Eucarística, Penitencia, Unción de los enfermos, Orden Sacerdotal y Matrimonio

Capítulo Primero

Los Sacramentos de la Iniciación Cristiana

Artículo 2 EL SACRAMENTO DE LA CONFIRMACIÓN

1291 Una costumbre de la Iglesia de Roma facilitó el desarrollo de la práctica occidental; había una doble unción con el santo crisma después del Bautismo: realizada ya una por el presbítero al neófito al salir del baño bautismal, es completada por una segunda unción hecha por el obispo en la frente de cada uno de los recién bautizados (cf San Hipólito Romano, Traditio apostolica, 21). La primera unción con el santo crisma, la que daba el sacerdote, quedó unida al rito bautismal; significa la participación del bautizado en las funciones profética, sacerdotal y real de Cristo. Si el Bautismo es conferido a un adulto, sólo hay una unción postbautismal: la de la Confirmación.

1292 La práctica de las Iglesias de Oriente destaca más la unidad de la iniciación cristiana. La de la Iglesia latina expresa más netamente la comunión del nuevo cristiano con su obispo, garante y servidor de la unidad de su Iglesia, de su catolicidad y su apostolicidad, y por ello, el vínculo con los orígenes apostólicos de la Iglesia de Cristo.

II. Los signos y el rito de la Confirmación

1293 En el rito de este sacramento conviene considerar el signo de la unción y lo que la unción designa e imprime: el sello espiritual.

La unción, en el simbolismo bíblico y antiguo, posee numerosas significaciones: el aceite es signo de abundancia (cf Dt 11,14, etc.) y de alegría (cf Sal 23,5; 104,15); purifica (unción antes y después del baño) y da agilidad (la unción de los atletas y de los luchadores); es signo de curación, pues suaviza las contusiones y las heridas (cf Is 1,6; Lc 10,34) y el unguento irradia belleza, santidad y fuerza.

1294 Todas estas significaciones de la unción con aceite se encuentran en la vida sacramental. La unción antes del Bautismo con el óleo de los catecúmenos significa purificación y fortaleza; la unción de los enfermos expresa curación y consuelo. La unción del santo crisma después del Bautismo, en la Confirmación y en la Ordenación, es el signo de una consagración. Por la Confirmación, los cristianos, es decir, los que son ungidos, participan más plenamente en la misión de Jesucristo y en la plenitud del Espíritu Santo que éste posee, a fin de que toda su vida desprenda "el buen olor de Cristo" (cf 2 Co 2,15).
