Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30pm-3:30pm at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9am daily Mass at St. John of God; every Thursday following 9am Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9am Mass. Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF

EUCCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call our DRE for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to or email Fr. Hostios to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS - If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. Hostios to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

“I say to you... so shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth, my word shall not return to me void, but shall do my will, achieving the end for which I sent it. Amen I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it and to hear what you hear but did not hear it... But blessed are your eyes for they see and your ears because they hear.”

We readily respond to the proclamation of the scripture at mass ‘thanks be to God.’ However, give it a second thought. Do I realize that I have just listened to my loving God, speaking to me, and expecting a personal response? The word is His message for me at this moment.

The moving story of the heroic Ulma family in Poland who gave their lives to save Jews, and were all Beatified in 2023. The director sought to discover who the Ulmas were and why Joseph and Victoria Ulma took such a great risk. The film shows the clash of two worlds - Nazi Germany and a Polish Catholic family.

This documentary was 20 years in the making and, when filming began, few people even in Poland knew of the great sacrifice of the Ulma family. By uncovering new details and getting testimonies from witnesses with memories of the Ulma family, this film reveals the motivations of both the heroic protagonists of this story and those responsible for such horrific crimes. Polish with English subtitles, and English language dubbed.

Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica Los Siete Sacramentos de la Iglesia

Bautismo, Confirmación, Eucarística, Penitencia, Unción de los enfermos, Orden Sacerdotal y Matrimonio

Capítulo Primero

Los Sacramentos de la Iniciación Cristiana

Artículo 2 EL SACRAMENTO DE LA CONFIRMACIÓN

1305 El "carácter" perfecciona el sacerdocio común de los fieles, recibido en el Bautismo, y "el confirmado recibe el poder de confesar la fe de Cristo públicamente, y como en virtud de un cargo (quasi ex officio)" (Santo Tomás de Aquino, Summa theologiae 3, q.72, a. 5, ad 2).

IV QUIEN PUEDE RECIBIR ESTE SACRAMENTO

1306 Todo bautizado, aún no confirmado, puede y debe recibir el sacramento de la Confirmación (cf CIC can. 889, 1). Puesto que Bautismo, Confirmación y Eucaristía forman una unidad, de ahí se sigue que "los fieles tienen la obligación de recibir este sacramento en tiempo oportuno" (CIC, can. 890), porque sin la Confirmación y la Eucaristía, el sacramento del Bautismo es ciertamente válido y eficaz, pero la iniciación cristiana queda incompleta.

1307 La costumbre latina, desde hace siglos, indica "la edad del uso de razón", como punto de referencia para recibir la Confirmación. Sin embargo, en peligro de muerte, se debe confirmar a los niños incluso si no han alcanzado todavía la edad del uso de razón (cf CIC can. 891; 893,3).

1308 Si a veces se habla de la Confirmación como del "sacramento de la madurez cristiana", es preciso, sin embargo, no confundir la edad adulta de la fe con la edad adulta del crecimiento natural, ni olvidar que la gracia bautismal es una gracia de elección gratuita e inmerecida que no necesita una "ratificación" para hacerse efectiva. Santo Tomás lo recuerda:

«La edad del cuerpo no prejuzga la del alma. Así, incluso en la infancia, el hombre puede recibir la perfección de la edad espiritual de que habla la Sabiduría (4,8): "La vejez honorable no es la que dan los muchos días, no se mide por el número de los años". Así numerosos niños, gracias a la fuerza del Espíritu Santo que habían recibido, lucharon valientemente y hasta la sangre por Cristo» (Summa theologiae 3, q. 72, a. 8, ad 2).

La Memoria litúrgica de Nuestra Señora del Carmelo fue instituida para conmemorar la aparición de la Virgen, el 16 de julio de 1251, a San Simón Stock. En el Primer Libro de los Reyes se cuenta que el profeta Elías se reunió en el monte Carmelo con algunos hombres para defender la pureza de la fe de su pueblo, y ganó un desafío contra los sacerdotes del ídolo Baal. Además, según la tradición, la Sagrada Familia se detuvo en este monte a su regreso de Egipto.

Inspirándose en Elías, se establecieron en el monte Carmelo grupos de monjes que seguían la regla de San Basilio; se encuentran testimonios de ello en el s. XI, cuando los cruzados llegaron al lugar. Hacia 1154, el noble francés Berthold, que había llegado a Palestina con su primo Aimerius de Limoges, patriarca de Antioquía, se retiró al monte Carmelo, y decidió reunir a los eremitas para que hicieran vida cenobítica. Los religiosos construyeron una pequeña iglesia en medio de sus celdas, dedicándola a la Virgen María, y tomaron el nombre de Hermanos de Santa María del Monte Carmelo. La orden del Carmelo adquirió así sus dos rasgos distintivos: la referencia a Elías y el vínculo con María Santísima.

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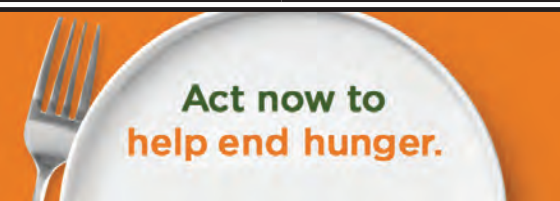
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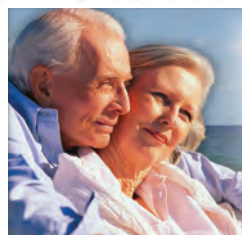
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
