Sacraments

RECONCILIATION - Every Saturday, 2:30pm-3:30pm at St. John of God; every Wednesday prior to 9am daily Mass at St. John of God; every Thursday following 9am Mass at St. John of God; First Saturdays at St. Raymond following 9am Mass; Fridays at 7pm prior to 8pm Mass in Spanish. Confession also available by appointment with a priest at the Parish Office.

BAPTISM - Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age, they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the home-bound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION - Please enroll your child in our Religious Education Program. Sacraments are given when the parish assesses that the child is ready, usually in the 2nd and 8th grades and after a minimum of 2 years of religious formation. Please call our DRE for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY - The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to or email Fr. Hostios to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS - If a man from our parish feels he may be called to the priesthood or diaconate, he is invited to speak with Fr. Hostios to explore this calling or call the Office of Vocations: 856-583-2864, or visit: camdenpriest.org.

“The Lord was pleased that Solomon made this request. So, God said to him: ‘Because you have asked for this – not for a long life for yourself, nor for riches, nor for the life of your enemies, but for understanding so that you may know what is right – I do as you requested. I give you a heart so wise and understanding that there has never been anyone like you up to now, and after you there will come, no one to equal you.’”

How frequently the expression, ‘the wisdom of Solomon’ describes someone who pauses, thinks things through, and then decides. This Old Testament giant individual offers a model. As I approach the Lord in my prayer today, He wants to know my care and need. ‘Ask something of me and I will give it to you.’

What is my response, my need, my care? How deep is my faith in the Lord that He listens or even cares? My response reflects the trust I place in my God. ‘Jesus, I trust in you.’ Please hear me. ‘Give your servant an understanding heart.’

Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica

Los Siete Sacramentos de la Iglesia

Bautismo, Confirmación, Eucarística, Penitencia, Unción de los enfermos, Orden Sacerdotal y Matrimonio

Capítulo Primero

Los Sacramentos de la Iniciación Cristiana

Artículo 2 EL SACRAMENTO DE LA CONFIRMACIÓN

1309 La preparación para la Confirmación debe tener como meta conducir al cristiano a una unión más íntima con Cristo, a una familiaridad más viva con el Espíritu Santo, su acción, sus dones y sus llamadas, a fin de poder asumir mejor las responsabilidades apostólicas de la vida cristiana. Por ello, la catequesis de la Confirmación se esforzará por suscitar el sentido de la pertenencia a la Iglesia de Jesucristo, tanto a la Iglesia universal como a la comunidad parroquial. Esta última tiene una responsabilidad particular en la preparación de los confirmandos (cf Ritual de la Confirmación, Praenotandos 3).

1310 Para recibir la Confirmación es preciso hallarse en estado de gracia. Conviene recurrir al sacramento de la Penitencia para ser purificado en atención al don del Espíritu Santo. Hay que prepararse con una oración más intensa para recibir con docilidad y disponibilidad la fuerza y las gracias del Espíritu Santo (cf Hch 1,14).

1311 La costumbre latina, desde hace siglos, indica "la edad del uso de razón", como punto de referencia para recibir la Confirmación. Sin embargo, en peligro de muerte, se debe confirmar a los niños incluso si no han alcanzado todavía la edad del uso de razón (cf CIC can. 891; 893,3).

V EL MINISTRO DE LA CONFIRMACION

1312 *El ministro originario de la Confirmación es el obispo (LG 26).*

En Oriente es ordinariamente el presbítero que bautiza quien da también inmediatamente la Confirmación en una sola celebración. Sin embargo, lo hace con el santo crisma consagrado por el patriarca o el obispo, lo cual expresa la unidad apostólica de la Iglesia cuyos vínculos son reforzados por el sacramento de la Confirmación. En la Iglesia latina se aplica la misma disciplina en los bautismos de adultos y cuando es admitido a la plena comunión con la Iglesia un bautizado de otra comunidad cristiana que no ha recibido válidamente el sacramento de la Confirmación (cf CIC can 883,2).

20 de Julio
S. Apolinar, obispo de Ravena y mártir

El primero en ejercer el ministerio episcopal en la ciudad imperial de Ravena por voluntad directa del apóstol Pedro, del que fue alumno, Apolinar lo administró durante casi 30 años, llevando a cabo una intensa labor de evangelización en la región que finalmente le valió el martirio.

20 de Julio
s. Elías, profeta

"El Señor es mi Dios": esto significa el nombre Elías. Profeta del siglo IX a.C., vive en Israel, consagrando su vida para despertar en el pueblo el reconocimiento del Señor como el único Dios, sin dejarse engañar por la idolatría. Energico e intransigente, desaparece alrededor del 805 a.C.

20 de Julio
s. Aurelio, obispo de Cartago

En el 391 o 92 Aurelio es obispo en Cartago. La Iglesia local está desunida por crisis internas y por la división perpetrada por el intransigente obispo Donato. Aurelio revitaliza la Iglesia respaldando al futuro gran Santo, Agustín. En cada decisión busca la sintonía con Roma. Muere en el 430.

s. Charbel Makhlu^f, sacerdote

Conocido como "el Padre Pío del Líbano", Chârbel Makhlu^f fue un monje maronita al que se le concedió permiso para vivir como ermitaño en 1875. Cerca de Dios, en silencio y en oración, se le atribuyeron muchos prodigios tras su muerte, especialmente curaciones milagrosas. Fue canonizado por Pablo VI.



24 de Julio
S. Cristina, virgen y mártir

Como muchas mártires de los primeros siglos Cristina es una joven que por amistad con Cristo encuentra enemigos en su familia. Su padre la somete a crueldades para que abjure su fe, sin éxito. Lo mismo harán otros hasta que dos flechas se cobrarán su vida. Se la recuerda de modo especial en Bolsena.



25 de Julio
s. Santiago el Mayor, apóstol

Discípulo de Jesús, protector de peregrinos y soldados, evangelizador de España. En la representación iconográfica es representado con el bastón del peregrino y el rótulo del Evangelio en la mano. Desde la edad media, multitud de peregrinos recorren el Camino de Santiago que conduce a su sepulcro.



25 de Julio
s. Cristóbal, mártir

San Cristóbal fue uno de los Santos mártires caídos durante la persecución de Decio. Su nombre posee un bello significado simbólico: portador de Cristo. Su fiesta se celebra el 25 de julio.

21 de Julio
s. Praxedes, romana, en la Iglesia fundada por ella en la colina del Esquilino

Hermana de Santa Pudenciana, Práxedes es una rica romana. Su padre, convertido al cristianismo, transformó su casa en una iglesia. Ella sola administró el bautismo y hacía celebrar la misa, pero bajo la persecución del emperador Antonio Pío murió mártir.

s. Ezequiel, profeta

El más firme de los cuatro grandes profetas de la historia de Israel, Ezequiel es venerado por la Iglesia como santo. Deportado desde el 597 con su pueblo a Babilonia, anima a los exiliados proclamando la Palabra de Dios. Su libro en el Antiguo Testamento está lleno de visiones y simbolismo.

S. María Magdalena, discípula del Señor

La fiesta litúrgica de María Magdalena fue establecida el 3 de junio de 2016 por el Papa Francisco, durante el Jubileo de la Misericordia. Reproducimos parte del decreto: "La decisión se inscribe en el contexto eclesial actual, que exige una reflexión más profunda sobre la dignidad de la mujer



23 de Julio
s. Brigida, religiosa, Patrona de Europa

De la nobleza, esposa, madre de ocho hijos, fundadora de la Orden del Santísimo Salvador. Santa Brígida nació en 1303 en Finsta, Suecia. La suya será la vida de una mujer moderna, marcada por los viajes, las experiencias místicas y los mensajes al Papa para que vuelva a Roma desde Aviñón.

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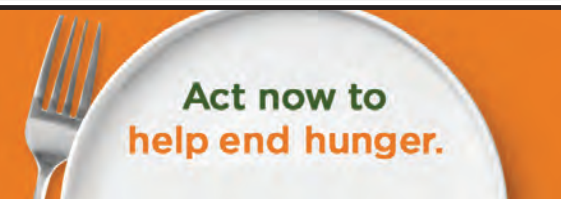
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
