#### SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

### SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. Infant baptism is offered to children aged 7 and younger. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

#### SACRAMENT OF THE SICK

If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the homebound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

### PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION

After two years of religious education, baptized children receive their First Holy Communion, usually the first weekend in May.

Confirmation is offered for those who have been baptized and received their First Holy Communion after several more years of instruction. Confirmation is usually administered when the young person is in the 8th grade. Please call Sr. Kathleen at the Religious Education office for more information.

### SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

### **Christ is Born!**


Come let us adore Him!

The word "epiphany" means a sudden understanding or manifestation. We usually think of it as a "EURIKA!" moment. When we use Epiphany in a religious context we are referring to a manifestation of the Divine Presence: God shows Himself to us.

In the Western liturgy Epiphany focuses on the first time God was revealed in the person of Jesus Christ to the gentiles: *Magi* from the East. Scholars say that they were possibly astronomers from Persia. This is the first time that someone from a different culture, of a different part of the world, encountered Jesus of Nazareth.

We know that Jesus is Savior of all people. The first members of the Church were Jesus' people, the Jews, but quickly we became a Church of the Nations. How can we help to manifest the Christ to all the nations? How can we make him known especially to those who do not know the Gospel? This continues to be our task. Christ is Born!


