SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. Infant baptism is offered to children aged 7 and younger. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK

If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the homebound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION

After two years of religious education, baptized children receive their First Holy Communion, usually the first weekend in May.

Confirmation is offered for those who have been baptized and received their First Holy Communion after several more years of instruction. Confirmation is usually administered when the young person is in the 8th grade. Please call Sr. Kathleen at the Religious Education office for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

Christ is Risen!

Last week Fr. Cesar and I announced that May 31-June 2 we will be having 40 Hours Devotion. Today, a little bit about adoration.

In the middle of the second century (~150 AD) St Justin the Martyr wrote about the celebration of the Eucharist and how the deacons of the church would bring the Blessed Sacrament to those who were sick or homebound. Since that time the Church has continued to expand on her understanding of the Eucharist. One of the great gifts that we have been given in our faith (outside of Mass and the other Sacraments) is the opportunity to pray with Jesus reserved in the Tabernacle. The Church prescribes for us various ways that we are to worship our Lord in this most holy gift. It is fitting then that we make “visits” to the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle when we can. During regular visits to the Blessed Sacrament we pray in a church where the Eucharist is reserved. Though we cannot see Jesus in the tabernacle we know He is present. A visit to the Blessed Sacrament is a private devotion. It can last any length of time.

Eucharistic Adoration or “Solemn Adoration” refers to a period of time set aside where we can gaze on our Eucharistic Lord in a visible way. Eucharistic Adoration is a public devotion of the Church that should be marked by liturgical rites such as the presence of lit candles, incense, song, etc. Eucharistic Adoration usually takes place over time, usually an hour though it can be shortened to 30 or 45 minutes. Though most of our time in Adoration is silent, we recognize that we are extending the prayer of the Mass through time.

Our 40 Hours of Adoration is meant to increase our love of our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament: at Mass, during Adoration, and in the Tabernacle. Pray with me that this devotion will bring renewal to our parish and the Church!

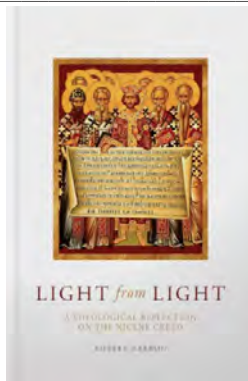

Did you know?

Canon No. 919 states:

"One who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain from any food or drink,

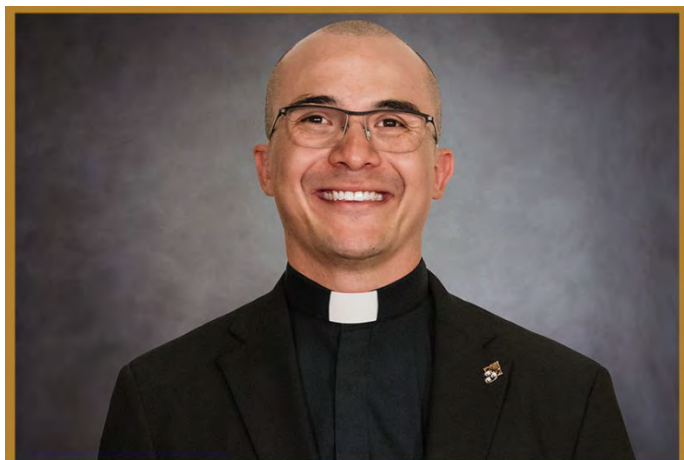
with the exception only of water and medicine, for at least the period of one hour before Holy Communion. So, it is NOT one hour before Mass begins, but one hour before Holy Communion. Keep in mind, also, that coffee, tea, juice and soda are NOT water. At this time there is no regulation on how long to fast after receiving Holy Communion. Some suggest at least 15 minutes. If one remains until the end of Holy Mass (as we must!) it will be about that length of time. God bless you!

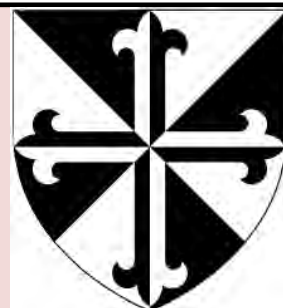
