SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents or legal guardians are welcome to call or make an appointment at the office for baptismal preparation. Infant baptism is offered to children aged 7 and younger. The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either after or during one of the Sunday Masses. Godparents will need an eligibility certificate from their proper pastor.

LETTER OF ELIGIBILITY/SPONSOR CERTIFICATE

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK

If someone is seriously ill, hospitalized, preparing for surgery, or failing due to advanced age they are welcome to call for a priest for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Please call the office for arrangements. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Communion to the homebound. The sick will be remembered in the bulletin for four (4) weeks; longer if requested to continue.

PREPARATION FOR THE SACRAMENTS OF EUCHARIST AND CONFIRMATION

After two years of religious education, baptized children receive their First Holy Communion, usually the first weekend in May.

Confirmation is offered for those who have been baptized and received their First Holy Communion after several more years of instruction. Confirmation is usually administered when the young person is in the 8th grade. Please call Sr. Kathleen at the Religious Education office for more information.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

The future bride or groom may contact the parish office requesting to be married. Marriage preparation usually takes 9-12 months. Please speak to one of the priests to confirm a date and arrange preparations.

Glory to Jesus Christ!

I pray that our 40 Hours Devotion has been a time of renewal and growth in the love of the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar!

Following our devotion this weekend, we are introducing some changes as to how we observe Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament is a public act of the Church. To that end it begins with exposition by a priest or deacon and concludes that way as well. During the period of Adoration there needs to be someone always present in the chapel. Therefore, our new Adoration schedule is as follows:

Monday-Thursday 9:30 AM until 2:00 PM. Friday 9:30 AM until 12:00 Noon. During this time, we will have Adoration using a Monstrance as the liturgical books require.

First of all, the Chapel will remain open from 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM, Monday-Friday. This is not changing. Secondly, we are doing this to give greater reverence to the Blessed Sacrament. Since my arrival there have been many times when people left the chapel empty while the Eucharist was still exposed. This could not continue. Thirdly, "adoration tabernacles" (like the one we had in our chapel) are to be used primarily in situations where there are no clergy present, such as convents or mission churches. This is not our situation. We always need to be doing what the Church asks.

I understand that change can be difficult. Fr. Cesar, a team of parishioners, and I have worked on this to continue to make Adoration accessible while having the mind of the Church. I am happy to increase our Adoration times as long as we can have more parishioners commit to signing up as regular Guardians of the Blessed Sacrament.

Remember, The Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus is Present in the Most Blessed Sacrament whether it is on the Altar at Mass, during our Reception of Holy Communion, in the Tabernacle, during Adoration, or even at night in the locked Church. The Real Presence is there whether we can see it or not! I hope that our new policy and format of Eucharistic Adoration bears much fruit in our parish and in the lives of all who visit us.

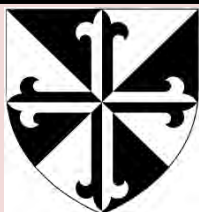

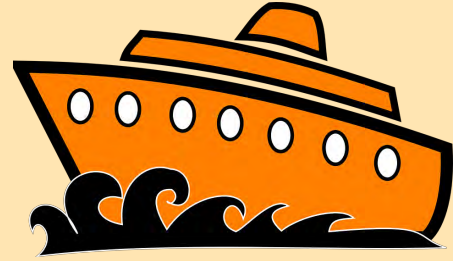

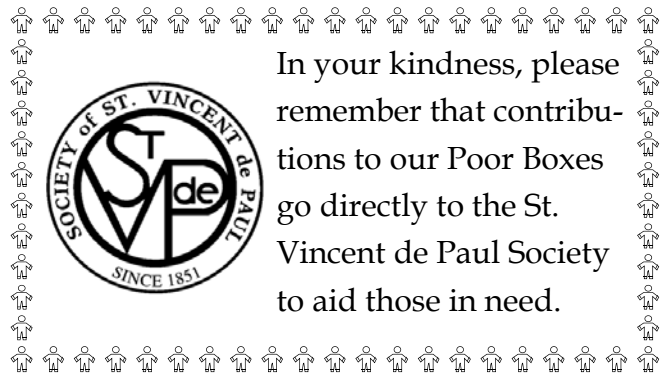

The Diocese of Camden presents our new Bishop: Bishop Joseph Andrew Williams

Bishop Williams was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis in 2002. His episcopal ordination took place January 25, 2022, the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul. Prior to his appointment as auxiliary bishop and current assignment as moderator and priest-in-solidum of the Church of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Saint Paul, he served as pastor of Saint Stephen in Minneapolis (2008-2022); parochial administrator of Holy Rosary in Minneapolis (2020-2022); ministered as a parochial vicar at the Cathedral of Saint Paul in Saint Paul (2002-2004) and at Divine Mercy in Faribault (2004-2005). He was pastor of Saint Mathias in Hampton and Saint Mary in New Trier (2005-2008). He has also served as coordinator of the Archdiocesan Outreach to Persons with Disabilities (2003-2005).

He was appointed the Archdiocesan Vicar for Latino Ministry in 2018. He is a member of the board of trustees for The Saint Paul Seminary and Saint John Vianney College Seminary. He has served as chaplain of the Minnesota House of Representatives.

Born May 2, 1974, to Dr. Gary and Mary McDonald Williams, Bishop Williams is the third of nine children. He grew up in Stillwater, where he attended Saint Croix Catholic School and Stillwater High School. His brother, Father Peter Williams, ordained in 2004, is a priest of the Archdiocese, and is Pastor of Saint Ambrose in Woodbury, Minnesota.

Bishop Williams holds a B.A. in biology from the University of Minnesota, Morris, graduating summa cum laude in 1996. He studied philosophy and pre-theology at Franciscan University of Steubenville, Ohio, from 1996-1998 and attended The St. Paul Seminary School of Divinity in St. Paul from 1998-2002, where he earned a Master of Divinity degree. He was ordained a priest at age 28.

Bishop Williams is known for his longtime ministry to Latino and Spanish-speaking Catholics in the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis, beginning in Faribault, where he and other parish leaders worked to bring healing to a Latino community that had been wounded by drug raids. Members of both of his most recent parishes are predominantly Latino, and he has worked to change negative cultural perceptions of undocumented immigrants. He has led neighborhood-based evangelization efforts, which include knocking on doors and inviting people to Mass and faith formation.

Today we remember Jesus' creation of the Most Holy Eucharist on Holy Thursday at The Last Supper. The feast of Corpus Christi began in the 13th century and after having this name for hundreds of years, in 1970, the name was officially changed to **The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**. Even after the change, many people still refer to the feast as Corpus Christi.
